Syllabus

(Effective from 2016-17)

Preamble

Mahatma Gandhi and his principles have great relevance in this era of Globalisation. Violent conflict and instability disrupt markets and societies. A peaceful environment is a pre requisite for successful business. Inclusive Growth is necessary for sustainable development.

This course is designed to inculcate strong values in students and sensitise the youth to the problems of the marginalized. It aims at training the students in the art of participatory management and peaceful methods of conflict resolution. Through an interesting and well-planned mix of lectures, presentations, skits, films, social outreach programmes and other activities it aims at developing the overall personality of students by helping them discover their latent talents and instilling leadership qualities.

Course Content (30 Hours)

Modules

- 1) Life of Mahatma Gandhi
- 2) Gandhiji and India's Freedom Struggle
- 3) Gandhian Principles and Values
- 4) Mahatma Gandhi and Cinema
- 5) Bapu- Leader of Leaders
- 6) Mahatma Gandhi and the Marginalised
- 7) The Gandhian Model in Economics and Management
- 8) Swadeshi and Khadi

3 hours have been assigned to each Module. (3x8=24) This will include lectures, films and participatory sessions like debates, skits, group discussions and presentations and other activities to spread the message of non violence.

Practicals will comprise of 5 hours on a Cloth Bag Project with a twofold objective of creating self-employment opportunities for marginalized women and protecting the environment.

1 hour has been allotted for the Gandhi Vichar Prachar (Peace) Examination to be conducted in collaboration with Mumbai Sarvodaya Mandal. It is conducted in English, Hindi, Marathi and Gujarati.

Evaluation Scheme

- 1) Peace Examination (Objective Type Questions) 80 marks
- 2) Written Examination of 2 Hours duration (Subjective Type Questions) 60 marks.
- 3) Participatory Sessions 20 marks
- 4) Cloth Bag Project 20 marks
- 5) Written Assignment Any Gandhian Book Review 20 marks

Total 200 marks to be converted into 100.
