Hence, to aid them in this problem, NKare had conducted a donation drive where the members collected sarees and blankets from the students to ship them to the victims of the flood. This donation took place in the month of December and needless to say that the supplies were couriered in time to relieve the victims in the time of need.

### **Seminar on Ladies Protection:**

A seminar was conducted on the topic of 'Ladies Protection in Mumbai' in the month of January. The speaker for the same was the Western Railway Commissioner of Mumbai. He had enlightened the students on the importance of women security and had also discussed the possible causes and prevention of crimes against women.

### COUNSELLING CELL

The counselling cell of N.K. College this year handled 90 cases. The most common cases that came to light have been stress related to coping with studies of college and competitive exam tutorials, career confusion, wrong career choices, depression, anxiety, parental pressure, relationship issues – parents as well as peers, emotional issues related to abuse, low self-esteem, poor body image, panic attacks and anger issues. This year more students sought career guidance as they were confused between what they wanted and parental choices. Even few in-house faculties sought counselling services.

Apart from this our college also extended counselling facilities for outsiders as a part of community outreach programme. Quite a number of people approached for counselling. The issues dealt were depression, marital discord, career guidance, coping with broken marriage, lack of ambition, parent trying to deal with the child's aggression and conduct.

During this year a workshop was conducted on relationships for NSS students and positive life skills for BSc CS students. Also their levels of aspiration were tested to give a more precise view about their lack of interest in studies.

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## 2. Title of the Practice

**2. Goal:** The help desk is to interface with parents and students seeking admission into our college both in the aided and self finance section. The desk is to make the entire admission process- student/ parent friendly. The BMM students learn community service and social responsibility in the process.

**3. The Context:** The process of seeking admission is often stressful for students and parents. There is a lack of awareness on admission rules, qualifying criterion and the documents that need to be submitted .It is to address this need that the initiative was born in May 2012.

**4. The Practice:** The committee is formed in May every year by the BMM Coordinator and students are trained on how to interact with parents, answer queries patiently regarding documents for submission etc .The students begin work on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of the announcement of 12<sup>th</sup> standard results. They work very closely with the Principal and office staff in dispensing information and guidelines. This community outreach programme lasts till the final list is put up. On an average , each day the desk that is manned by 50 students in rotation .They assist over 200 parents and their wards each day .The Desk is functional after lecture hours between 10.30am and 1.30pm.A feedback session is conducted every two days to review the process and discuss parents' suggestions if any.

**5. Evidence of Success:** Since 2014 the desk has expanded it's brief to handle queries regarding the junior college admissions as well. The feedback diary records the visitors' comments. The comments have been encouraging. Students have been consistently praised for their patience and quick and clear guidance to every query.
