The form was circulated among the students and 3,306 responses were received. The details are given in the following report. This report is divided into three parts:

Female students responded higher in numbers than the male students. 92.6% where Undergraduate students, 4.9% were Post-Graduate students and the remaining are other students. 52.5% of the respondents are from Commerce, 25.7% of the respondents from Science, 13.6% of the respondents from Arts, 5.3% of the respondents from Professional and the remaining were from other.

Analysis Report:

3,306 students responded to this survey, where 44.9% are male, 54.9% are female and 0.15% is transgender. 92.6% where Undergraduate students, 4.9% were Post-Graduate students and the remaining are other students. 52.5% of the respondents are from Commerce, 25.7% of the respondents from Science, 13.6% of the respondents from Arts, 5.3% of the respondents from Professional and the remaining were from other.




Figure 1: Gender-wise responses




Figure 2: Subject-wise and gender-wise responses

Gender-wise responses are shown below in Figure 1, Figure 2 and Figure-3.





Figure 3: Program-wise and Gender-wise responses

Observation and action taken:

In general the recommendations made by the students are reasonable and relevant. The Principal reviewed the report on the analysis of the feedback. During a meeting with the teachers, the principal gave everyone appreciation for the positive aspects of the feedback. In order to preserve and raise the standard of instruction, teachers were advised to continue with their current efforts.

The suggestions given by the students are taken into serious consideration. Teachers are advised to use more interactive teaching techniques along with real life examples, case studies to make the lecture more interesting and fruitful. Also to use better graphics and visual media to engage students well.

Infrastructural issues mentioned in the feedback, such as issues with library and canteen are corrected immediately. More emphasis should be placed on promoting internships and campus recruitment efforts, according to student feedback. Placement Cell has been asked to invite more number of recruiters on the college campus and provide more internship opportunities to the students.

A few recommendations are made for increasing the number of revision sessions and practice mock exams prior to exams. Faculties are asked to take more unit based examination and revision sessions before exams. Remedial lecture were planned for slow learners by the respective subject faculties.

Some students suggested for One day Industrial Visits based on their curriculum which will be considered. For practical based subjects few students have asked more Lab lectures which is conveyed to the respective head of departments.

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
