2) To recommend the Governing Body on suggestions pertaining to the academic affairs made by it.

The Examination Committee has put forward that from academic year 2020-2021 the examinations would be conducted in the ratio of 60:40 instead of 75:25. For 40 marks internal Autonomy is to be given to the faculty for the design.
