The total percentage of passing, after taking into consideration all undergraduate and postgraduate programmes was 90.12%, which is an improvement from the previous year's score, with an excellent overall attainment score of 2.74. The seamless conduct of all these examination sessions ended with the timely declaration of results, which on an average, was within 14 days. It is a matter of pride for all of us, that the several reforms brought in by our Examination Committee, has become an example for other autonomous colleges. One such example is the Exam Connect Programme, particularly designed to assist students facing academic challenges, including backlogs or ATKT. It is thus no wonder that the Controller of Examinations Summit organized by the Committee was attended by Principals, Vice Principals, IQAC coordinators, and Controller of Examinations, from across 21 colleges in and around Maharashtra.

Many thanks to the Controller of Examinations Ms. Elizabeth George who has expertly handled the challenges of coordinating the evaluation and assessment of our numerous students under so many different courses and programmes. I also thank the Professors in Charge – Dr. Monikantan Nair, Dr. Madhukar Dalvi, Dr. Meha Mandawewala, Ms. Anisha Asirvatham and all the other members of the Examination Committee for their exemplary contribution. It has been our College's endeavour to make education accessible to students across various socioeconomic strata. On that front I would like to express my gratitude to Mr. Thomson Thomas, Professor in Charge of the Students' Aid Fund, for helping deserving students with financial difficulties avail of funds to continue their education. Many thanks to Ms. Sheetal Gogri, the College Counsellor and Remedial Educator, who helped our students aptly face



the challenges of student life. Our FYBSM student, Khanna Ayush secured 4th place in inter – Zonal Archery Championship University of Mumbai and Participated in All India, inter - university Archery Championship. Here I would specifically like to mention the contribution of our three coaches, Mr. Santosh Ambre for athletics, Mr. Sudhir B. Thankachen for football and Mr. Nilesh Thakkar, for volleyball. Our TYBA student, Hetavi Shah continued successfully competed in the 33rd Veer Savarkar All India Sea Swimming Competition on 29 Feb 2024 and completed a distance of 16 Nautical Miles, which is roughly a distance of 25 kms in 08 hours 16 min in the Arabian Sea. She completed 19kms in the 78th World longest National open water swimming competition in the Bhagirathi River. She is the first female athlete to successfully swim 3 times in the world's longest International open water marathon swimming. She won a Gold Medal at the DENSEN SEA SWIM CHAMPIONSHIP 2025. I heartily congratulate Mr. Thomson Thomas and his team for mentoring our students and helping them transform into star athletes. The Gujarati Sahitya Mandal organised many events like the intercollegiate fest "Kalray", annual competition "Tahuko", the popular "Gurjar Vaani" course, Rang Raas Garba and Gita Jayanti to promote Gujarati culture and literature. The Marathi Sanskrutik Mandal organised diverse and enriching activities. 

KASC celebrated Chartered Accountants Day and GST Day on July 1, 2024 by organising a Session for faculty members on 'Let's Talk Money Matters'. Faculty member CA Hardik Thakkar was the resource person. He shared valuable insights on income tax planning, saving strategies, investment opportunities and retirement planning. On the same day, Principal Prof. Dr. Moushumi Datta and Vice Principal Prof. Dr. Mona Mehta felicitated all the meritorious students who had cleared the CA Intermediate Examinations of May 2024.

THE DEPARTMENT OF LIFELONG LEARNING AND EXTENSION

Throughout the 2024-2025 academic year, the Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension (DLLE) significantly enriched student experience through a diverse and impactful program of engaging activities, promoting active participation, creative expression and substantial personal student development. The academic year commenced with the First Term Training session on 31st July 2024 at St. Francis College in Borivali. One Faculty teacher member of DLLE and two student managers of Nagindas Khandwala College's DLLE unit were deputed for this training, gaining valuable insights into DLLE's activities. This created student and community engagement. The Department held a contact session on 19th September 2024, during which 115 students (45 Males and 67 Females) submitted and presented flyers under CG and CA addressing a comprehensive range of issues pertaining to Consumer Guidance and Civic Sense the projects under DLLE for the students.

On September 20th, 2024, Dr. Sulbha Raorane, our area Field Coordinator of Mumbai University, gave training session to the students. It was attended by 148 students (71 males, 77 females). Her insightful presentation emphasized the dual benefits of DLLE activities: contributing to societal well-being and fostering robust character development through practical experience. On 20th September 2024, a total of 115 Students (45 Males and 67 Females) from the DLLE Unit also showcased their understanding of civic sense and consumer protection by presenting creative slogans in various languages. With the elections closing in, a total of 105 DLLE students together (48 Males and 57 Females) launched a vibrant voting awareness campaign from 13th November 2024 to 20th November 2024. DLLE Students created flyers and slogans for voter awareness. These flyers emphasized the importance of civic participation and inspired citizens to exercise their right to vote. All students participated and distributed the flyers to other citizens in their vicinity. This created a student and community engagement. The Second Term Training was held on 9th December 2024 at the Fort Campus at University of Mumbai. One Faculty teacher member of DLLE and two student managers of Nagindas Khandwala College's DLLE unit were deputed for this training and they attended this session. The DLLE heads emphasized fieldwork, documentation, and student engagement, providing practical guidance and reinforcing our commitment to community development.

On 20th December 2024 a poster exhibition cum competition was organised at Nagindas Khandwala College (Malad) to Motivate students to challenge their inner creativity and imagination and learn more about Civic Sense and Consumer Guidance which was judged by Field Coordinator Dr. Sulbha Raorane and Prof. CA (Dr.) Reena Desai. The second term training of the students was conducted on 20th December 2024 at Nagindas Khandwala College (Malad). In the second-term training program, the field coordinator provided comprehensive guidance on key project objectives, methodologies, and implementation strategies.

This year, 11 faculty members applied for seed money grants for conducting research under various titles. The management approved a total amount of Rs. 4,35,000/- to all the applicants. The Proposals were submitted on 22nd April, 2024 against which the grant amount was disclosed and disbursed on 30th April, 2024. All the researchers presented their six monthly progress report on Saturday, 21st December, 2024 and submitted the final research report on 15th March, 2025. The academic year started with a high enthusiasm as the students of UG and PG started preparing for the 19th Aavishkar 2024, the intercollegiate research convention conducted by the (Department of Student Development) DSD of University of Mumbai. The elimination round for this convention was conducted at the college level for UG and PG students in the college on Friday, 2nd August, 2024. In this collegiate elimination round 12 teams participated. Each team was given 10 minutes to express their research ideas and possible outcome viz. 'Aavishkaar'.

The first Zonal round was held on Friday, 13th December, 2024 at KES College, Kandivali West. A total of 10 teams and individuals from UG, PG and Ph. D. programs participated at the UG, PG and Ph.D. levels. Ms. Sonali Singh a Ph.D. student of our research Centre, under the teacher mentor Prof. (Dr.) Mona Mehta, won the poster and the podium rounds and succeeded towards the Inter-Zonal Round. The Interzonal round of Aavishkar was held at Saraf College on 17th December 2024, where Ms. Sonali Singh won the Poster Round. The Six-Monthly Presentations of all Ph.D scholars of our research Centre was conducted on 10th October 2024.

The elimination round of Aavishkar 2024 was conducted successfully on 2nd August, 2024 featuring an enthusiastic participation of 12 teams from streams across the College. The event aimed to identify the most innovative and viable projects for the final competition. Each team presented their projects, showcasing their creativity, technical skills, and problem-solving abilities. The presentations were judged based on originality, feasibility, and impact. About Prof. Dr. Bhushan Patwardhan


Professor Bhushan Patwardhan is a distinguished academician with over four decades of experience in higher education, biomedical research, and institutional governance. A Fellow of the National Academy of Sciences and the National Academy of Medical Sciences, he is also an Adjunct Professor at the National Institute of Complementary Medicine, Western Sydney University, Australia.

A global thought leader in integrating traditional medicine with modern science, he co-chaired the WHO Expert Group for the Global Centre for Traditional Medicine. His contributions to policy and education reform include key roles in the National Knowledge Commission, Planning Commission, NITI Aayog, and WHO Geneva. As former Vice Chairman of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and Chairman of NAAC, India, he played a pivotal role in shaping India's National Education Policy 2020, introducing innovative concepts like the Academic Bank of Credit. He is internationally recognized for his efforts to combat predatory publishing. As Chair of the UGC-CARE Consortium for Academic Research Ethics, he led significant initiatives to uphold academic integrity, including a widely cited Nature Worldview article on the subject.

Among his many honors are the Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel Award, SASTRA Mahamana Award, Sir Ram Nath Chopra Oration, and Waldemar Haffkine Oration. His enduring contributions continue to shape academic integrity, transdisciplinary research, and global health innovation. His research contributions span transdisciplinary studies, biomedical innovation, and global health. He holds eight Indian and two US patents, has supervised 20 Ph.D. scholars, and received numerous research grants. With over 175 scientific publications, a Scholar h-index of 62, and 15,300+ citations, he ranks among the world's top 2% of biomedical scientists. His latest book, Genome to Om: Evolving Journey of Modern Science to Meta-science, has received global acclaim.

The 17th Subject Board meeting was held on a hybrid mode on 27th January 2025 and members discussed and approved the Third-year syllabi keeping NEP 2020 requirements in mind for implementation in the Academic Year 2025-26 onwards. Two SY students, Prutha Kadakia and Srushti Shah presented a well-researched paper on, "The Dual Facets of Digital Lfe: Understanding Privacy and Security". This was at a Conference headlined: "Navigating the Digital Landscape. The Multifaceted Impact of Social Media on Student Development". Mrs Preethi Rao was their mentor and guide for the same. The Department of Multi Media and Mass Communication from Nagindas Khandwala College in association with Mohalla Committee Charitable Trust performed a street play on the topic, "Cyber Crime Awareness",

educating people on digital fraud and how to prevent such scams. This was on December 7th, 2024 for the occasion of Human Rights Day celebrated globally on 10th December 2024.

The socio-cultural documentary on "The Village of Bastards-The story of Natpurwa", was screened on the 17th of February 2025. The under 60 mins documentary told the story of Natpurwa a little village about 70kms away from Lucknow. Here a large percentage of women follow the oldest profession of the world-sex work. Many children do not know who their father is. Vibe Out Entertainment team captured life as it exists at Natpurwa and the attempts being made to change. Al Jazeera a well reputed News House of the Middle East was the one to give this name to this village. Vibe Out Entertainment borrowed this name for the documentary. We are specially proud as the executive producer, Devashish Baagdi is an alumnus of the Department having passed out from our college in 2017. With Assembly Elections slated for the 20th of November 2024, we worked on the invitation of the Police Department to present an informative skit on voting awareness at the "Matdan Janjagruti" held at Prabodhan Thackeray Natya Gruha, Borivali West, Mumbai. We called the play, MA-KA-BO Ka Superhero, who encourages everyone to be a responsible citizen. The street play was conceived by TY Journalism student Tejas Jain with ample directive inputs from Manish Salian. The day after the voting on 21st November the Department conducted an in house exit poll to ascertain who would be winning the Vidhan Sabha elections and an overwhelming 91.2% predicted a Shiv Sena-BJP win. This prediction by our future psephologists proved correct as we watched the results live on the 23rd of November 2024. The purpose of the entire exercise was to bring alive through hands on exposure to an active democracy that India is proud of being.

The First year and Second year students of the Department visited The Arena Animation Academy to gain industry insights on the world of VFX and animation. They were accompanied by faculty member, Ms. Sherlin Mary Rajan. On 20th February, learners worked closely with Anchor, Tanya Purohit, Onturfnews for a Vox Pop project. The theme centered around the upcoming Champions Trophy season. His work, selected from a pool of high-quality entries, highlights the power of the press in driving policy change.

The Department of Multi Media and Mass Communication celebrated the 15th edition of Montage on the 20th of December, 2024. The theme was on Viksit Bharat @2047. The celebrity guests were Vaibhavi Shandilya actor from Indian cinema, Laksh Maheshwari a Story Teller and Yogita Bhayana a social activist who heads the people against Rape in India. DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTANCY

There are 12 undergraduate, 12 graduate, and 1 general elective course available in the department of Accountancy. Conferences and seminars, career counselling sessions, financial literacy programs, guest lectures on cutting-edge subjects, intercollegiate and intra collegiate competitions, job fair, industrial visit, celebration of world literacy Day, CA day, Income tax day and, social extension activities, etc. were some of the events conducted in the year 2024-25. The Department, in association with the Department of Banking & Finance, IQAC and MKES IMSR organised an ACCA sponsored International Conference on Accounting, Business, Economics and Finance (ICABEF 2024) on July 5, 2024. The Chief Guest of the conference was Mr. Joydeep Sen, a corporate trainer, author and columnist. Dr. Arpita Joardar, Fulbright Scholar and Associate Professor at Charlton College of Business, University of Massachusetts, Dartmouth delivered the keynote address. CA Hrudyesh Pankhania, Elected Regional Council Member of Western Region of ICAI and CA Dr. Sangeeta Pandit, HOD Finance, Sydenham Institute of Management were the keynote speakers at the two technical sessions. ACCA representatives Mr. Prabhanshu Mittal and Mr. Rohan Rajvanshi also graced the occasion with their presence.

50 in-house faculty members and 47 participants from industry and academia attended the same. A total of 42 papers were presented across 5 tracks on topics such as integrating sustainable development goals into HR practices, impact of stress on working college students, user perspectives on free digital services, impact of budgeting on personal finance, etc. ICABEF 2024 provided an ideal





platform for the presentation of new advances and research results in the fields of financial reporting, banking and financial intermediation, economics, ESG reporting, innovation and entrepreneurship. Thereafter, 20 papers were published in an ISBN book titled 'Global Innovation and Sustainable Development in Accounting establishment Business, Economics and Finance', under Khandwala Publishing House. 2 papers were published in Scopus Indexed Journal and the remaining papers were published in UGC CARE and ISSN Peer Reviewed Journal.

The Department in association with the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, organised a session on Career in Accounting & Finance for Youth & Career Counselling Programme for CA course on August 29, 2024. The resource person CA Jyoti Aiya guided the participants about various career opportunities in the field of accountancy and finance, with special focus on the Chartered Accountancy course. The session was attended by 243 students of F.Y.B.Com. & S.Y.B.Com. On the occasion of World Literacy Day, the Department of Accountancy and the Department of Banking & Finance organised a Book Review Competition on September 19, 2024. 21 students registered for the competition, out of which 11 participants were shortlisted for the final round. The shortlisted participants put their best foot forward and gave engaging and comprehensive reviews of books on the topics of accountancy, banking and finance. The event was judged by Mr. Brian Cutinho. Viraj Keyur Shah from F.Y.B.Com. was declared the winner and Prapti Pandya from S.Y.B.Com. was declared the runner-up.



On November 29, 2024, the Department teamed up with the Students' Council to organise an Elocution Competition for students under Forum of Free Enterprises. The topics for the competition pertained to Finance and Economics such as Digital Infrastructure – A New Strategy to Integrate India and Economics Reforms - the Unfinished Agenda. The event was judged by our faculty member Dr. Saswati Mohanty. 16 students registered for the competition. Pratha Patel from T.Y.B.M.S. was declared the winner. The Department organized a one-of-a-kind inter-collegiate festival FinFest 2024 – Finance Fiesta on December 20, 2024. There were 3 events viz. Debate, Just a Minute and Quiz. 46 students from 7 colleges participated in the festival. Prof. Dr. Kavita Kalkoti & Asst. Prof. Furqan Shaikh were the esteemed judges for Debate and Asst. Prof Poonam Shah & Asst. Prof. Edwin Mathias were judges for Just a Minute.

The Department, in association with Skill Development and Vocational Training Institute of India, organized a mega Placement Drive on February 4, 2025. The Placement Drive was inaugurated in the presence of Principal Madam Prof. Dr. Moushumi Datta, Vice Principal and IQAC Coordinator Prof. Dr. Mona Mehta and Dr. Rajesh Chheda, Director, Raj Software Technology. More than 200 students appeared for interviews in the Placement drive in which 20 companies participated. Some of the participating companies were LIC, L & T Finance, Aditya Birla Capital, Motilal Oswal, and Tata AIA Life Insurance. On February 11, 2025, the Department of Accountancy in association with Skill Development and Vocational Training Institute of India arranged for multiple sessions on Financial Literacy for F.Y.B.Com. & S.Y.B.Com. students. The resource person Dr. Raina Champawat educated students on key financial concepts such as budgeting, saving, investing and managing debt. The sessions aimed to empower students with practical knowledge to make informed financial decisions and prepare them for a financially secure future. More than 350 students benefitted from the sessions. The Department organized a Masterclass on Accounting Standard 10 (Property, Plant and Equipment) and Accounting Standard 20 (Earnings per share) on February 20, 2025 for T.Y.B.Com. students. Since these accounting standards are part of the curriculum for T.Y.B.Com. students, the session by CA Vishesh gave students an opportunity to expand their learning experience beyond the classroom and get expert insights on the topic. Department of Geoinformatics and PG Geography

discussing contemporary career opportunities in Geography and Geoinformatics. The event was followed by the release of a book contributing to academic discourse in Geography and Geoinformatics.

Additionally, on 28th November 2024, a Poster Presentation was conducted to mark National Clean Air and National Clean Water Month, where students creatively depicted the importance of air and water conservation through informative and visually engaging posters. Samarth Krupa Agro Farm offers a perfect blend of organic farming and exceptional accommodations, providing a refreshing escape from city life. The farm owner arranged an organic farm tour and guided the students, explaining various plants, their characteristics, importance, growth cycles, ripening periods and different species of plants and trees. The visit also emphasized the importance of agriculture and introduced students to a solar-driven water pump, goat farming, dairy farming, fish farming (pond), poultry farming, rabbit farming, vermicomposting, nursery practices, polyhouse farming, and coir fibre production. Students also participated in activities such as bullock cart rides, tractor rides, rifle shooting, archery, badminton, carrom, table tennis, and swimming. F.Y.B.A. Geography Major students participated in an inter-collegiate PowerPoint presentation competition on 28th February 2025. In this competition, Zara Shaikh secured 3rd place, and Nitish Pandey won the consolation prize. This competition was organized by Swami Vivekanand College of Arts and Commerce, Dombivli, in collaboration with The Bombay Geographical Association. A group of 47 students from T.Y.B.A. Geography conducted a research project titled "Travel Motivation Survey (Mumbai Suburban Area), which enhanced their research skills in Paper IX. Conducting basic research on travel motivations helps students understand tourist behavior, decision-making, and influencing factors. It enhances market analysis skills by identifying trends, preferences, and economic aspects of tourism.

Through survey design and data interpretation, students develop strong research and analytical abilities. Studying cultural influences provides insights into how traditions and festivals shape travel patterns. Analyzing social media and advertisements helps them grasp modern marketing strategies. Researching environmental and ethical concerns fosters awareness of sustainable tourism. Understanding financial and policy aspects aids in tourism planning and infrastructure development. Critical thinking and problem-solving skills improve as students explore solutions for sustainable and responsible tourism. This research equips students with practical knowledge beneficial for careers in tourism, geography, marketing, urban planning, and sustainability.



Examinations and Evaluations

The Examination and Evaluation process is a crucial aspect of the education system, serving as essential tools to assess students' learning outcomes. The systematic implementation of these processes ensures the credibility and academic rigour of our institution. A detailed report on the examination and evaluation procedures adopted in A.Y.2024-25 highlight the key initiatives, tentative calendar of examinations, and overall student performance. A tentative calendar of examinations was prepared and, upon approval from the Board of Examinations, the Principal, Vice Principal, and IOAC Coordinator, added to the academic calendar. The Examinations Committee successfully adopted the State of Maharashtra's Phase-1 implementation directives of National Education Policy 2020 (NEP). Thus, as directed, the credit distribution structure was followed for Major, Minor and Open Electives, VSC, SEC, IKS, AEC, and VEC with an evaluation pattern of CIE and SEE of 50:50 marks and 25:25 marks. Under the guidance of Principal Prof. Dr. Moushumi Datta and the Academic Enrichment Committee, 22 Co-Curricular courses were successfully conducted across all programmes with the support of all Heads of the Departments, and Programme Coordinators of various Committees, Cells and Student Council under the following categories: Community Enrichment activity, Student Enrichment Activity, Sports, and Cultural Activity. The Rubrics for all of the above were marked for the evaluation. The students welcomed this new change with open minds and enjoyed this experiential learning. A total of 6316 students appeared for the Even Semester Examinations in April 2024, and the pass percentage across all programmes was an impressive 90.12% across all UG and PG programmes. The number of days for the declaration of results took an average of 14 days.



The programme attainment value for all programmes is greater than or equal to 2.5. The overall attainment of all UG/PG programs is 2.74, which is an excellent score. There were grievances / revaluation reported and 0.3% status change was observed.

One of the significant initiatives introduced progressively was the inclusion of the ABC ID (Academic Bank of Credits) in the grade cards for all programmes. This innovative approach enabled students to accumulate credits from various institutions and utilize them to pursue their academic goals more effectively. The results are live for verification on DigiLocker for all the students.

The first half of A.Y. 2024-25 witnessed the Semester End Examinations in October 2024 onwards for all programmes. The Semester I/III and V examinations were conducted for all students with First and Second-year students following the NEP pattern and Third year students with 60:40 pattern. The new examination reforms such as research–based projects and internships for students, OBE evaluation with rubrics enhanced the teaching learning reforms. The BBA and BMS programs under AICTE conducted examinations in February 2025. A total of 6808 students appeared for the Even Semester Examinations in October 2024 onwards and the pass percentage across all programs 82.56% across all UG and PG programmes.

The best practices conducted by the examinations and evaluations committee in the academic year 2024-25 saw the introduction of several new initiatives aimed at enhancing the student experience and providing them with the necessary support to overcome academic challenges. Controller of Examination Summit: January 9, 2025 marked an incredible milestone as the Controller of Examinations Summit brought together Principals, Vice Principals, IQAC Coordinators, and Controller of Examinations from across the education sector at Nagindas Khandwala College, 7th Floor C wing Smart Classroom. The event was a resounding success, fostering dialogue, collaboration, and innovation in the field of Evaluations management under the new NEP. The summit was attended by overall 47 participants from across 21 colleges in and around Maharastra.



The keynote speakers were Dr. Mahesh Kakade, Director, Board of Examinations and Evaluation, Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune; Dr. Pramod Bhadakwade, Controller of Examination at Symbiosis Skills & Professional University, Pune; Dr. Sanjay Dhole, Director, Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Savitribai Phule Pune University. These dignitaries set the tone with insights on the future of assessments. Resource persons shared expert perspectives on digital transformation, NEP reforms, and strategies to enhance fairness and transparency in evaluations. The interactive panel discussions featured engaging conversations on overcoming challenges in large-scale assessments and embracing technology in examination processes. The summit was a reminder of the power of collaboration in driving meaningful change in the education system. The Exam Connect Programme was launched as a proactive initiative under the leadership of Chairperson and Principal, Prof. Dr. Moushumi Datta, with the support of Vice Principal and IQAC Coordinator, Prof. Dr. Mona Mehta, who provided streamlined guidelines for its implementation. The initiative was conceptualized and led by Dr. Monikantan Nair, who spearheaded the efforts under the BCOM/BA section, with valuable support from Heads of Departments across all programmes.

Additionally, Dr. Meha Mandawewala provided key insights for the Self-Financed (SF) Commerce section, while Ms. Anisha Asirvatam played a crucial role in addressing students' concerns related to practical examinations. The event witnessed a hybrid mode of participation, with 213 students joining online and 30 students attending offline in the 7th-floor smart classroom. Students actively engaged by seeking clarification on internal submissions, syllabus details, and examination schedules. The Heads of Departments and Exam Committee members meticulously addressed individual concerns, offering personalized guidance on the syllabus and academic progression. The Exam Connect Programme was particularly designed to assist students facing academic challenges, including backlogs (ATKT). Its primary objective was to foster clarity, transparency, and efficiency in handling student concerns related to academic progression under the National Education Policy (NEP). By providing a platform for direct student interaction and expert guidance, the initiative reinforced student support mechanisms and ensured a structured approach to academic success.

The second half of A.Y. 2024-25 began with the ATKT examinations held on 21st February for Semester I/III/V for UG and PG programmes and Semester I/III for PG programmes. The Regular examinations for Semester II/IV and VI for UG and PG programmes were conducted from 24th March to 12th April 2025. The results are awaited for the same. The whole hearted cooperation and the tireless efforts of Examination Professors in Charge and the faculty team members is highly appreciated. We appreciate the efforts of the Examiners, Moderators and Paper Setters of both UG and PG sections for their whole hearted support and cooperation in the smooth conduct of the examinations. The non-teaching staff marched along with us as a team to complete the examinations and results in record time. This is a testament to the effectiveness of these initiatives and the commitment of the examination committee to ensuring a smooth and successful academic journey for all students. We congratulate all the students who have successfully cleared their exams and wishing them the best for their future endeavours.



Women Development Cell in association with students council & National service scheme (B28) organized 'YOGA FIESTA 2024' on the occasion of international Yoga Day on June 21, 2024. 29 faculty members & 45 students had participated in the session which was taken by Mr. Fenil Purohit. An event on Personal Hygiene and Personality Development was organized on three consecutive days, 29th, 30th, and 31st July, 2024.

The session was exclusively for girls, providing insights into personal hygiene and strategies for holistic development. The Orator of the whole event was Ms. Saniya Pathan currently serving as a freelancer and web-designer. Firstly, The Orator commenced the event with the importance of communication, confidence, body language, punctuality in our day to day lives. She also emphasized on upgrading oneself, setting goals and putting efforts to achieve them. She also spoke on the relevant impact of time bound approach, appearance, tone which helps us in our workplace, school/college life.





Secondly, coming on the topic of personal hygiene she mentioned ways in which periods could be tackled which would assists us to be calm and cool during menstruation. The session was very informative and all the attendees (students) received hampers after the session. The Women Development Cell organized an Election Awareness Campaign on 16th November to educate and encourage young women about the importance of voting. The initiative aimed to ensure that every eligible female voter exercises her right to vote and actively participates in the democratic process. As part of the campaign, WDC students distributed informative pamphlets to young women above 18 years of age, highlighting the significance of making an informed choice in elections. These pamphlets emphasized key aspects such as the role of voting in democracy, the impact of individual votes, and the responsibility of choosing the right leader. To reinforce the message, students not only handed out pamphlets but also interacted with recipients to discuss the importance of voting. Additionally, as a part of the documentation process, each student clicked a picture with the voter ID card holder, ensuring that the campaign reached its intended audience effectively. The activity was met with a positive response, as many young women expressed their willingness to participate in the upcoming elections.

On 20th November, WDC conducted a Voting Awareness Activity to promote civic responsibility among students. This initiative aimed to ensure that our students, who actively work for the development of women, also fulfill their duty as responsible citizens by participating in the voting process. As part of the activity, we had to take a picture of our hand with the voting mark as proof of our participation. This served as a reminder of the importance of voting and encouraged others to do the same. Being the coordinators of WDC, we took the lead in organizing and overseeing the entire activity, ensuring that it was conducted smoothly. The initiative successfully reinforced the message of responsible citizenship and the significance of voting in shaping the future. Women Development Cell organized a talk on Prevention of Domestic Violence on 5th December, delivered by Mrs. Mangala Marathe, an active member of Swadhar, an NGO dedicated to women's empowerment and awareness. The session aimed to educate students about the harsh realities of domestic violence, the struggles many women face after marriage, and the importance of standing against abuse. During the talk, Mrs. Marathe addressed critical issues such as harassment, emotional and physical abuse, and the ways in which women are often controlled and silenced in their own homes. She also discussed the role of family, society, and legal frameworks in providing protection and justice for victims.

The session was highly insightful and thought-provoking, shedding light on the importance of spreading awareness and taking action against domestic violence. It left the audience more informed and motivated to support and advocate for women's safety and rights. Members of the Women Development Cell (WDC) actively participated on 7th February in the industrial visit to Adlabs Imagica and Yusuf Meherally Centre, gaining valuable insights into various industries and cooperative businesses. After the IV students were taken to Imagica, where they explored technological and operational aspects of large-scale amusement parks, while at Yusuf Meherally Centre, they learned about self-sustainability, traditional craftsmanship, and eco-friendly practices. "A Grateful Goodbye: Reflecting on 33 Years at Nagindas Khandwala College" - Nita Dhote

As I bid farewell to Nagindas Khandwala College after 33 years and 3 months of service, I am filled with gratitude, nostalgia, and pride. What began as a long cherished dream —nurtured by stories of my uncle, a school headmaster in Karnataka, and a retired teacher named Tai who lived in our building—grew into a fulfilling vocation that shaped who I am today.

My teaching journey started in Parle (now Sathaye) College, followed by a brief stint at Bhavan's, and finally, in 1991, at N.K. College. Initially, the boisterous students seemed intimidating, but with time—and under the visionary leadership of Ancy Ma'am—I realised that students, like saplings, needed nurturing and care. I found joy and purpose in mentoring them, and in return, they taught me patience, humility, and empathy.

The support from the M.K.E.S. Management was instrumental. I still remember their thoughtful gesture of offering financial assistance during the early days when our approvals were pending. 

<u>ડિજિટલ ડિટોક્સ: શું આપણને તેની જરૂર છે?</u>

આજના યુગમાં સ્માર્ટફોન, લૅપટોપ અને સોશિયલ મીડિયા આપણા જીવનનો અભિન્ન ભાગ બની ગયા છે. દરેક સૂચના માટે આપણે સ્ક્રીન તરફ દોડી જઈએ છીએ. પણ શું ક્યારેય વિચાર્યું છે કે આ સતત ડિજિટલ એક્સપોઝર આપણા માનસિક અને શારીરિક આરોગ્ય પર શું અસર કરે છે?

સાથે જ મળતી આવેલી માહિતીના ધોધ અને સતત નોટિફિકેશન્સ મગજને થકવી નાખે છે. ઊંઘમાં ખલેલ, ધ્યાનમાં ઘટાડો અને સંબંધોમાં તણાવ જેવા દોષ પર પડતાં પરિણામો આપણે જોઈ શકીએ છીએ.

અત્યાર સુધીમાં થયેલા સંશોધનો દર્શાવે છે કે નિયમિત "ડિજિટલ ડિટોક્સ" – એટલે કે થોડા સમય માટે મોબાઈલ અને સ્ક્રીન થી દૂર રહેવું – હતાશા ઘટાડવામાં અને મનને શાંત કરવામાં મદદરૂપ બની શકે છે. કોલેજના વિદ્યાર્થીઓ માટે ખાસ કરીને, ડિટોક્સ તેમની એકાગ્રતા વધારવામાં અને શિક્ષણમાં સુધાર લાવવામાં અસરકારક સાબિત થઈ શકે છે.

ડિજિટલ ડિટોક્સ માટે રોજ 1-2 કલાક માટે ફોન બંધ રાખવો, નોન-ડિજિટલ શોખ વિકસાવવો (જેમ કે વાંચન, ચિત્રકામ), અને સ્નેહીઓ સાથે પ્રત્યક્ષ સમય વિતાવવો સારી શરૂઆત બની શકે છે.

અંતે, ટેક્નોલોજી ખરેખર અમૂલ્ય સાધન છે, પણ તેનો સંતુલિત ઉપયોગ જ આપણને આરોગ્યમય જીવન તરફ લઈ જાય છે.

શિક્ષણ દરેક માણસનો મૂળ અધિકાર છે. દરેક બાળક, ભલે તે કોઈ પણ પૃષ્ઠભૂમિમાંથી આવે, તેને ગુણવત્તાવાળું શિક્ષણ મળવું જોઈએ. પરંતુ હકીકત એવી છે કે ગરીબી એ શિક્ષણ માટેનું સૌથી મોટું અવરોધ છે. ભારત જેવા વિકાસશીલ દેશમાં લાખો બાળકો એવા છે કે જેમણે સ્કૂલનું મોઢું પણ જોયું નથી. ગરીબ પરિવારોમાં જન્મેલા બાળકો માટે શિક્ષણ હજી પણ એક સ્વપ્ન સમાન છે. ઘણા બાળકો પરિવારનું પેટ ભરવા માટે કામ પર જાય છે અને શિક્ષણથી વંચિત રહી જાય છે. આવાં બાળકો માટે વિશેષ શાળાઓ શરૂ કરવી એ એક મહાન પહેલ છે. ઘણી સરકારી યોજનાઓ, NGO અને ભણેલાં સમાજસેવકો ગરીબ બાળકોના શિક્ષણ માટે કાર્ય કરી રહ્યા છે. આવી શાળાઓમાં બાળકોને ફ્રીમાં શિક્ષણ, યુનિફોર્મ, પુસ્તકો અને ક્યારેક ક્યારેક સવારે-સાંજના ભોજન જેવી સુવિધાઓ પણ આપવામાં આવે છે.

શાળાનું મહત્વ અને બાળકનો વિકાસ

શાળા એ માત્ર અભ્યાસ કરવાની જગ્યા નથી, પરંતુ એ એવી જગ્યા છે જ્યાં બાળકનો સર્વાંગી વિકાસ થાય છે. જ્યારે કોઈ ગરીબ બાળક પ્રથમવાર શાળામાં પગ મૂકે છે, ત્યારે તેના જીવનમાં નવી આશાની કિરણ જાગે છે. શિક્ષણ તેને જીવન જીવવા માટેના નવા દ્રષ્ટિકોણ આપે છે. શાળા તેની અંદર છુપાયેલ ક્ષમતા ઓળખવા માટે એક પ્લેટફોર્મ પૂરું પાડે છે. આવો વિચાર કરો કે એક બાળક જેના માતાપિતા રોજ કામ પર જાય છે અને માત્ર રોજિંદા ખોરાક માટે જ ઝઝૂમતા હોય, તે બાળક ક્યારે કલ્પના કરશે કે તે એક દિવસ ડોક્ટર કે ઇજનેર બનશે? આવી કલ્પનાઓને સાચી શક્યતા બનાવવા માટે યોગ્ય શૈક્ષણિક માળખું અત્યંત જરૂરી છે

સરકારની ભૂમિકા

ભારત સરકાર્રે ઘણા ઉદાહરણરૂપ પગલાં લીધાં છે જેમ કે સરસ્વતી સાધના યોજના, વિદ્યાલક્ષ્મી યોજના, મધ્યાહ્ન ભોજન યોજના, RTE (Right to Education) એક્ટ વગેરે. આ યોજનાઓનાં મુખ્ય ઉદ્દેશ્ય એ છે કે દરેક બાળક ભલે ગરીબ હોય કે ધનિક, તેને એક સમાન શૈક્ષણિક તક મળે. સમાજનો સહયોગ અને NGOનું યોગદાન

સરકાર એક હદ સુધી મદદ કરી શકે છે, પણ આ મિશન સફળ થાય એ માટે સમાજનો સહયોગ જરૂરી છે. ઘણા NGO જેવી કે "પ્રથમ" અને "સ્નેહલાયા" વર્ષોથી ગરીબ બાળકો માટે શાળાઓ ચલાવી રહ્યા છે. તેઓ માત્ર શાળા પૂરતી મર્યાદિત નથી રહેતા પણ બાળકોના માતા-પિતાને પણ જાગૃત કરે છે કે તેઓ પોતાના બાળકોને ભણવા માટે મોકલે.

આજના યુગમાં ટેક્નોલોજીનો ઉપયોગ કરીને પણ ગરીબ વિદ્યાર્થીઓ સુધી શિક્ષણ પહોંચાડી શકાય છે. મોબાઇલ એપ્લિકેશન્સ, ઑનલાઇન કલાસ, ડિજિટલ લર્નિંગ પ્લેટફોર્મ જેવી સુવિધાઓ વિદ્યાર્થીઓ માટે ભણવાનું સરળ બનાવે છે. ઘણાં NGO આ ટેક્નોલોજીનો ઉપયોગ કરીને અંતિમ ગામડા સુધી શિક્ષણ પહોંચાડવાનો પ્રયાસ કરી રહ્યા છે.
