

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
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

Interview with Dr. (Mrs.) Ancy Jose

(Served as the Principal for the longest term in the University of Mumbai)

From a college with just 2 classrooms, we have grown tremendously, what do you feel about this growth under your leadership?

Firstly it is the blessing of the Almighty and after I got the position of Principalship, I had to rise up to the occasion and put in a lot of effort and I am very proud that my entire team of students and faculties co-operated and it was their passion and hardwork which made all of this possible.

What is the most important thing you learned as a leader having lead the college for so many years?

My leadership is my HR skills, human relations and how to manage people, that comes with taking everyone as a team, no one can achieve much individually... individually someone can achieve things at personal level by doing research, publishing papers, etc. but taking everyone together and working with vision and passion is what is required to acquire success.

What are the three words that describe you the best?

Discipline, Dedication and Determination

What kept you motivated to be associated with this institution for more than 3 decades?

I love this institution and this institution has given me everything. Whatever name and fame I got is because of this institution. It's the students who contributed a lot for my success and whatever I am today is because of Nagindas Khandwala College.

Can you tell us any life changing experience that you have gone through?

Life changing experience itself was the way I took up the post of Principalship. I only wanted to be a Lecturer, just take the lectures and leave. I never thought of taking up an administrative position. During my initial 1 year, I was an In-Charge Principal. I did not think like an In-Charge Principal, I always kept taking decisions and kept moving ahead. So this Principalship itself was a life changing experience. Opportunities do not come again and again but when opportunity knocks at your door, one should take it.

What was the most challenging part of your professional journey and how did you overcome it?

The most challenging part was to grow the institution. In 1983 when we started this college, there were so many colleges already around. People used to go from here to other colleges... so I decided that a time should come when students should ask for my college and then come. The first milestone was to get good students to the institution and after that was to maintain the quality.

What was your vision when you joined the college and do you feel you have accomplished it by now?

My short term vision was to bring in quality. In order to maintain quality and compete with the other institutions, I started working hard. The government had come up with NAAC accredition then. Our college was only 18 years old then. We still decided to go for the NAAC accredition. We were the 7th college in Mumbai to go for the NAAC accredition. The first was Kelkar College which was also very old and had an enterprising principal too. We prepared the SSR in just one month for which I must compliment my colleague Kalkoti. The NAAC team came and all the staff members did a wonderful job. We then went in 2008 for NAAC accredition where we got an 'A' grade. We again went in 2013 and got an 'A' grade. I used to give a lot of importance to sports and extracurricular activities. So you will see a lot of activities here.

What has been the driving force of your life?

One has only one life and I wanted to do something good in life. I always kept one thing in mind, do good, never harm anyone and never take revenge. This kept me driving constantly to do more and more.

Does satisfaction become a barrier to success?

A certain level of satisfaction is required to move ahead but over-satisfaction becomes a barrier to success. If you study economics, when you start a business you work hard, you earn profits and then you feel that you have achieved everything you wanted to. That moment, that thought onwards, the graph of your growth goes downwards. A certain level of satisfaction motivates a person.

What would you suggest a student to learn maximum from his college life?

Participate in all the activities and grab all the opportunities. You must be disciplined and humble. Arrogance will not take you anywhere. The students must try to achieve certain values while in college and when any opportunity comes, participate in that, be it very small. If you participate in all the activities in these 3 years, the amount of experience you take home will definitely make you a successful person. There should be a balance of studies and extra-curricular activities. Respect elders and take their advices as they will always give you appropriate advices.

What have you learned from your failures?

Convert it into success.

Failure is a stepping stone towards success. You need to be failing at times. If you don't receive failures then you may become overconfident.

What is the one message you have for students?

Be happy, humble, passionate and hardworking Don't crib, introspect your failure and without God's blessings nothing bad will happen to you.

What is your definition of happiness?

Self-conscious effort to be content, faith in yourself, gracefully accepting your failures and working on your failures is my definition of happiness.

Under your Principalship, the College has done many social activities, especially the School Reconstruction Project, why is social work important in a student's life?

The Library and Information Centre organised a short-term course on Online Information Sources, Tools and Techniques (COIST) for PG students and several webinars for faculty members and students. We provide a virtual library and 'Ask a librarian' service to users. Generally it is said that Google can get you 1000 answers for a question but a librarian can get you the right answer and this is so true for our librarian Ms. Sonali Vhatkar.

Research is to see what everybody else has seen, and to think what nobody else has thought. The research cell conducted a National Level Web Conference on 'Beyond Pandemics: Reimagining the New Normal' on 18th February 2022. To set the quality benchmark in publications and research projects of our faculty and students, Turn-It-In plagiarism software is purchased and is being used effectively. At present we have 5 research guides and 22 research students who have registered for a Ph.D. under them. Since we Khandwalites are research oriented and have begun to lay greater emphasis on research in this academic year, ten research projects were granted under the scheme of Seed Money by Management to our faculty.

IQAC is an integral part of any institution and has an important role to play in its growth and development. Internal Quality Assurance Cell plays a vital role in maintaining and enhancing the quality of any institution. Several programmes and training initiatives were taken by IQAC in this academic year. IQAC organized a training programme to sharpen the skills of teachers. Infact, sixteen man days of training was provided by the IQAC. At Khandwala we truly believe that quality is everyone's responsibility.

We enlisted for ISO 9001:2015 certification to keep a vigilant eye on the quality of our academic standards and processes. The ISO Certification Audit was conducted by TUV Nord, Germany from 10th to 12th January 2022. The college received the ISO 9001:2015 certification without any nonconformity. Further Internal Audits are held on a six monthly basis. We have also undertaken Academic Audit to help us identify areas of improvement so that we can continue on our path of quality expansion.

We have gone for the internationalization of Higher Education. Our College and University of Frazer Valley, Vancouver, Canada have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding to promote international and intercultural understanding and academic cooperation and collaboration for IT/CS students. It is a unique program where the students can study for two years in Nagindas Khandwala College and two years at Frazer Valley University. The college has also entered into MoU with Royal Roads University. An MoU is signed with University of Canberra, Australia for 2+1+1 ½ years program i.e. two years in Nagindas Khandwala College, one year in University of Canberra to complete the under graduation program followed by 1 ½ year of MBA program.

My congratulations to all the students who brought laurels to the college through their participation in the various Inter-Collegiate competitions. Heartiest congratulations to Nidhi Harsora, Shruti Naidu and Anagha Karandikar for getting selected in the West zone Inter-University tournaments in Volleyball, Hockey and Badminton respectively. Heartiest congratulations to Hardik Aherkar as well for being selected in the All India Inter University Archery Championship.

My heartfelt thanks to CA. Dr. Varsha Ainapure for effectively nurturing our autonomy. Under autonomy, we have modified the curriculum to reduce the gap between industry and academia. The short term courses which students have to obtain during their studies in the college helps them to be employable. Controller of Examination of our college, Mr. Thomson Thomas and Deputy Controller Ms. Elizabeth along with the dedicated members deserve a special word of appreciation.

Khandwala Publishing House (KPH) is the official publication unit of our College. KPH has published 4 books with ISBNs in the academic year 2021-22. KPH has also published a multidisciplinary research journal. We had applied for Registrar of Newspapers for India and have received confirmation from New Delhi. 




Obituary



An Induction Programme for newly appointed teachers was conducted from 5th to 10th July 2021. The purpose of the programme was to familiarise the newly appointed teachers with the College and its way of functioning. It also gave the newcomers an exposure to new and innovative ways of teaching and learning. The schedule of the same was:

A one-day National Webinar on 'Nurturing Entrepreneurial Ecosystem in Under Graduate Colleges' was organized jointly by RUSA and the IQAC Cell of the College on 9 July 2021. The session was addressed by Dr. Tulsi Jayakumar, Professor of Economics and the Chairperson of the Family Managed Business at the S.P. Jain Institute of Management & Research, SPJIMR's FMB programme. The session suggested various strategies that can be followed to create entrepreneurial ecosystem in the College.

Five-Day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) "Train the Trainer" was organized for newly appointed faculty members from 4th to 13th August 2021. Intensive training on how to use on MS Excel was provided. The training was provided by faculty members from the IT/CS department. The programme provided excellent insights on the use of MS Excel. The FDP was immensely appreciated by the teachers. Training Programme on 'Creation of Google Scholar Profile' was jointly organised by IQAC and Library and Information Centre for the faculty members on 5th August 2021.



Endeavour 2021 - Empowering Educators

was organized on 11th December 2021. The topic for Endeavour was 'Understanding and Preventing Burnouts.' The speaker for Endeavour was Ms. Debasmita Sinha (Counselling Psychologist). Ms. Sinha explained the meaning of burnout and suggested simple and realistic strategies to manage burnout.

A session on 'Overview of Budget and insights into Personal Finance' was organized on 21st February 2022 for the Teaching Faculty. The same session was organized for the Non-Teaching staff on 28th April 2022. The speaker of the session was Mr. Hardik Thakkar, Assistant Professor at Khandwala College. The session gave insights on the budget, personal finance, cryptocurrency and investment. Mr. Thakkar explained various strategies for managing finance. One of the strategies mentioned by him was the 50/30/20 rule. It states that 50% of the salary must be spent on necessities of life, 30% on comfort and luxury and 20% of the salary must be saved for retirement. The session enhanced the knowledge of the participants on personal finance.

A session on 'Patent Drafting' was held on 10th March 2022. The speakers of the session were Lt. Dr. Kantilal Nagare, Ms Pooja Menon, Dr. Dinesh Wanule. The session threw light on the various steps that must be followed to get a patent registered. The session provided insights and encouraged the faculty members to apply for patents.

A One Day National Conference on 'NEP 2020 - Its Implementation in Higher Education' was organized on 26th April 2022. It provided insights on the changes that are going to take place in education and how NEP can be implemented by Higher Educational Institutions.

A Workshop on 'Yoga and Holistic Health' was jointly organised by IQAC and N.S.S Unit (B-28) in collaboration with W.R.C of I.C.S.S.R on 29th April 2022. It was thoroughly appreciated by the participants. Sixteen man-days of training was provided by the IQAC for this Academic Year. The IQAC will continue its quest for improving quality and it's search for excellence.

Under ISO, two quality objectives were taken up viz.


- (i) To provide six man-days of training programme for faculty members and

ONE DAY NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON NEP 2020 - ITS IMPLEMENTATION IN HIGHER EDUCATION Organized by IQAC. Sponsored by WRC, ICSSR

With the encouragement of our eversupportive management - the Malad Kandivali Education Society, a day-long National Conference on 'NEP 2020 - Its Implementation in Higher Education' was organised by IQAC of the College and was sponsored by WRC and ICSSR which took place in the Jagmohandas Gokaldas Memorial Hall on 26th April 2022.



The conference commenced with the Welcome address by Dr. (Mrs.) Ancy Jose, Director, MKES. She said that the college staff is ready to accept the challenge and it will be possible to implement the NEP. She complimented the I/c Principal for the initiative and thanked ICSSR for funding the conference. She welcomed the guests, Dr. Manoj Kumar, Prof. Smita Shukla and the participants of the conference.

I/c Principal, Prof. Dr. Moushumi Datta spoke about the college: the number of programmes offered, its many awards and the highlights of its journey. Talking about WRC and ICSSR, increasing capabilities of learners, she added that the participants will get knowledge about the implementation of NEP and its profound impact on education. Vice Principal, Asso. Prof. V. G. Suchak introduced both the Keynote Speakers, Dr. Manoj Kumar as well as Prof. Smita Shukla, Hon. Director, WRC, ICSSR, who gave the Presidential Address.

In his Keynote Address, Dr. Manoj Kumar, Joint Secretary, UGC, shared the context of the NEP - the



current problems and moving towards multi-disciplinary courses and curriculum is now the foremost requirement in the NEP. He talked about how things will be radically different for the new learner (CUET for admissions, emphasis on promoting regional languages, international collaboration and dual degrees). The teacher will have to transact

with students on a multi-disciplinary level and the 'Tight but light regulation' will be the new norm. "A Parliamentary approval is required to bring in new bodies in place of the current institutions", he added.

Prof. Smita Shukla told the gathering that the vision of an educational institution must take into consideration all stakeholders. Specific guidelines will be coming but it is necessary to understand that NEP has already been implemented. She hoped that autonomous institutions will take advantage of the changing scenario and introduce new degree

programmes or distance mode She programmes. talked about the concern of UGC that quality is mapped properly so that it does not suffer in the process of going in for new programmes. Public institutions must stav vibrant if quality is to be maintained.



There were three technical sessions:

1. Dr Ashish Puranik, Vice Principal of BMCC, Deccan, Pune discussed two UGC documents NHEQF (National Higher Education Qualification Framework) and LOCF (Learning Outcome based Curriculum Framework) in detail. He showed how to translate the NEP into reality through a complete hand-holding session. He elucidated the difference between Core



and Skill courses. the multiple entry, exit and reentry points and Curriculum the -> course LO -> programme LO -> graduate profile. explained Не different levels increasing complexities different elements (skills), according to the framework from level 5 to level 10.

2. In the next session, Dr. Puranik, said the LOCF document made by the UGC states that a bachelor's degree can be awarded when a student demonstrates outcomes of Knowledge, Understanding, Skills, Attitude and Values. He explained how course learning outcome should be in alignment with the programme outcome. Student will learn according to outcomes. Evaluation must be done according to the Bloom's taxonomy. He demonstrated how programme outcome can be correlated to all the course outcomes in that particular programme through Excel sheet.



3. The next speaker of the third technical session, Mr. Virendra Shukla, a senior management faculty of MSFDA which has signed MOUs with different educational institutions in Maharashtra, showed how to introduce transformation into the education system. The session called 'NEP 2020- Higher Education Institutions in Maharashtra - Ethics and Values Implementation. MSFDA and IOFC: An Experience Sharing' explained how to make India a knowledge economy and society through a holistic and multidisciplinary framework. He talked about the six pillars of ethics and value implementation. He described the program run by the MSFDA for inculcating ethics in the curriculum. He added that they are friends with the Moral re-armament - Initiatives of Change, IOFC Asia Pacific, Panchgani.



The day ended with the Valedictory function by Dr. Sanjay Deshmukh, Professor of Life Sciences, University of Mumbai who was the Chief Guest. Vice Principal, Dr. Mona Mehta – the Convenor of the Conference and the IQAC Coordinator, presented the conference highlights. In his address, Dr. Deshmukh traced the history of the establishment of different universities across India from British times. He praised this NEP which has been drafted after 34 years to enhance the young generation of learners. He complimented the College for selecting apt speakers for the conference. He lauded the teacher-leaders, the Principals as the leaders-in-making and complimented the women in the academic workforce.







on 'Branding in Advertising' was organized on 28th March 2022 for the SYBCOM and SYBA students by Mr. Keshavan Satashiv.






DRAMA CLUB






Insight 🖔

TYBAMMCJournalism batch students, in the course Reporting, were prepared for 'The News Anchor - A Test in Application'












SPORTS MANAGEMENT











BACHELOR IN TOURISM & TRAVEL MANAGEMENT


B.A. HONS. IN APPAREL DESIGN & CONSTRUCTION






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Gandhian Studies Centre

NKare Social Cell



Youth with Vision



'Soaring High for Elevating Lives'

PROJECT PATANG - 'Making People Fly High'

The main objective of this project is to ignite a ray of hope to the orphans, physically challenged, senior citizens, destitute and mentally challenged people. On the occasion of Children's Day i.e. 14th November 2021, we visited Dayavihar Ashram. We played games and provided them snacks. Our team distributed clothes to the slums in Borivali and Kandivali on 30th November 2021. Our team distributed blankets to the needy people on streets. On the auspicious day of Makar Sankranti i.e. 14th January 2021, YWV gifted a wheel chair to a destitute handicap person. Another wheelchair was gifted on 14th March 2022. We distributed clothes to the Immanuel Mercy Home; home for the destitute on 29th April 2022.

Project Poshan - Nourishing the Malnourished

Project Poshan focuses on nourishing the poor and the underprivileged and promoting a healthy living. Our team distributed grocery kits in Karambeliwadi, Raigad District, Pen Taluka on 3rd July 2021. We distributed grocery in Sulewadi, Raigad District, Pen Taluka on 7th July 2021. Our team visited the slums of Kandivali and Borivali and provided snacks and juice to the kids on 9th July 2021. We took an immediate initiative by providing help to the victims of the Chembur and Vikhroli landslide by providing groceries on 31st July 2021.

On the occasion of Children's Day i.e. 14th November 2021, we distributed lunch to the street kids. A lunch distribution drive was conducted from 1st December 2021 to 14th February 2022 on the streets of Mumbai City. We distributed more than 1000 lunch boxes over two months. We also distributed biryani to needy people on streets on 25th December 2021. 'Chaas Distribution Drive' was organized by the team from 1st April to 30th May 2022. A 'Grocery distribution drive' was organized in Karambeliwadi, Raigad District, Pen Taluka on 29th April 2022. We also cooked nutritious food for the village kids on the same day.

Project Pehel - A step towards Humanity

Project Pehel is a 4 day camp at an Adivasi village adopted by our college - Karambeliwadi situated in Raigad District, Pen Taluka. Project Pehel was organized from 28th to 31st October 2021. Our team painted the school and also created educational and aesthetic artworks in Balwadi. On 28th October 2021, our team distributed 150 grocery kits in the village. Our Team gave oil massage to the old people in the village. We distributed stationery kit which included pen, pencil, pouch, water bottle, tiffin box, scale, eraser, sharpener and geometry kit to the kids of the village on 29th October 2021. Our team cleaned the whole village. They also collected clothes from old people's houses to wash them. Our team distributed clothes to the villagers on 30th October 2021. On 31st october 2021, Karmbeliwadi school was inaugurated.t

Project Parivartan - School Recontruction Project

School Reconstruction is the biggest milestone we have achieved this year. We reconstructed a school in an Adivasi village named Karambeliwadi with a view to give a better learning experience to the kids in the village. The reconstruction started in the month of September and culminated in the last week of October. The school was inaugurated on 31st October 2021 with an inauguration ceremony. We were honored to have our college dignitaries, Gram Panchayat and the school teachers in the ceremony. The college dignitaries were welcomed with the folk dance and they later inaugurated the school by cutting the ribbon. We had various cultural performances by the kids of the village followed by the folk dance. We had a felicitation ceremony for the dignitaries.

The team distributed sanitary pads to women and girls to help them understand the importance of menstrual health and promote a healthier living. In the afternoon, our team members and villagers together cooked 'Mahabhog' i.e. their traditional lunch, for the whole village. Sweets were distributed on the occasion of Diwali.

The past two years will be remembered in history as the most challenging years for the entire world. Our generation has never heard and seen anything like this before. We all have shared the same experience, fear and challenges. We have heard stories that gave us chills. I don't even have to tell you what I am talking about. My question to you is, are you prepared for the new order of the changing world?

Don't be scared. All the recent studies show light on the concept of Digital work. It's no longer a secret that working from home or remote work is the new normal. You may ask me what difference it makes to you as a student. It makes a huge difference; it opens up a vast door of opportunity and creates a challenge by you competing for a role across India or the world. It also means that you will have to develop a new set of skills. Think of it as how the internet was unknown in the year 2000 and the students were new to the kind of jobs it created.

Working remotely changes a lot of things for you. You will have to perform at a different paradigm. I have written an article on my website titled 'Making Indian Youth more employable' where I have spoken about those skills in detail, and more than 1500 students have viewed them. The main takeaway from the article was that the human skills that you need to learn to work in a remote company are a bit different. You can either learn it on the job or learn it while you are still in college. The choice of shaping your career is with you. You can always pace your learning curve and craft your skills at your speed. The only thing you have to do is learn it by doing and not by reading about it. Reading is good to gather information, but if you want results, you must do something about it.

You can gain these skills faster if you have a online community of like-minded people and a mentor is ready to invest time in your development. In today's world, this is far easy to do. You only need a will to change along with the new world. You don't have the choice because otherwise, you may miss opportunities. Let me tell you my story. I am performing skills at work which didn't exist during my college time. I am a social seller, podcaster, digital marketer, data science enthusiast, etc. No one defined any of the job roles, and I had to navigate them while building my business. Some skills will define your growth at your workplace and you should start mastering them at a young age.

Your ability to navigate the internet to find the answer yourself will set you up for success. I have given a guest session to the student of our college about 10 Skills that you need to cultivate. Those are some of the human skills (soft skills) you may be aware of. The question is, "How are you going to apply it in the remote work environment?" My suggestion for you is to get some work that you can do, as a project or one time guided work. The only condition is to do it from home. The learning can be from finding such jobs, completing them on time, taking feedback from the mentors and sharing your experience with the rest of the world.

If you think you cannot do it while in college, talk about this idea with your friends. Tell them that Vikram Shetty of 73bit has shared this idea which doesn't sound realistic. Do you own research by reaching out to business owners and startup founders on Twitter, LinkedIn or Instagram? Ask for some work that they think you can do it? Be very specific about how you can bring value to them? I am not a fan of free labour, so you set up some fees for your work. Start with small and see if you can find a job and learn some skills while working.

I firmly believe and practice, 'Stay in charge of You, don't let the Outside world Control You'- Bob Proctor


What are the ingredients for being happy?

The very thought of saying 'Goodbye' has made me emotional and my spirits dampen at the very thought of it. With these emotions, I shall make an attempt to share the memories of my sojourn here with you all in the last 38 years. Having started my teaching career with MKES Junior College on 2nd July 1984, I was ushered into the MKES Parivar. I worked in the junior college for two years. Due to fewer classrooms, the Junior college lectures were conducted in two sessions in the space-crunched premises of the present Sheth N. L. School. Lectures were conducted in two classrooms alone and the office, Principal's Cabin and the Staff Room functioned from a third room. The adjacent small area on the ground floor was the canteen and its upper portion housed the library. However, within a period of six months, the college shifted its locale to the then newly constructed and the present main building. Initially it was a two-storied structure and gradually got modified into a four-storied building. After many years, two additional floors were constructed in the rear-side to accommodate more divisions.

My journey with the Degree College started in June 1986. It was MKES College then. However, in April 1987, the MKES College was renamed Nagindas Khandwala College. My tenure from June 1986 to May 2022 (36 Years) is truly a long one. During this period, I had the good fortune to work under three Principals namely, Late Mr. K. N. Tirodkar, Dr. (Mrs.) Ancy Jose and Prof. (Dr.) Moushumi Datta. The founder Principal late K. N. Tirodkar was a stalwart in Commerce. The Non-Cooperation Movement of 1920

An Economic Analysis

Today when we talk of a self-reliant India, I strongly believe that its foundation was laid by the Father of our Nation, Mahatma Gandhi, years ago. The year was 1920 when he gave the call to start a Non-Cooperation Movement against the British Government for its faulty policies. There was public unrest against British governmental reforms and the prevailing economic crisis plaguing the nation. Famines and epidemics made the situation worse for the common man.

Under this movement, it was decided that foreign goods would be shunned and that the accent would be on the manufacture and business of Swadeshi articles. Foreign clothes were boycotted and a bonfire was made of such things at several places publicly. This movement is an important chapter in the fight for India's Freedom Struggle. With the Non-Cooperation Movement taking wings, it evoked feelings of nationalism in people who used to see only oppression. They also started feeling that come what may India would get freedom from British rule.

Gandhiji also exhorted students to boycott government-run institutions saying that "Education that does not impact character is of no use to anyone." He also requested lawyers and advocates to quit government courts. Big names like Motilal Nehru, M R Jaykar, Vallabhbhai Patel and others put their might behind this call of the Mahatma. Amidst feelings of nationalism and patriotism, Gandhiji gave the mantra of Swadeshi to the entire nation. 'Be Indian, Buy Indian' became the buzzword for oppressed Indians. I feel that even the foundation for the present Government programme 'Make in India' was laid during the Non-Cooperation Movement of 1920.

E F Schumacher in his book 'Small is Beautiful' has mentioned the importance of manufacturing products on a small scale which proves to be profitable. Although the economist John Maynard Keynes is well-known for his macroeconomic theory to solve the problem of unemployment, according to me, Bapu's contribution in this field is even more significant. He was a welfare economist with practical ideas. Gandhian economics always advocates the idea of small scale production in which there is no exploitation of workers and the environment and there is justice and equality. It gives importance to man and not to machines.

Gandhiji believed that the Charkha represented the Spinning Wheel of progress and always emphasized that the real India resides in the villages and not in the cities. A country progresses only if its villages are developed and self-reliant. The rural economy is the backbone of a country's economic development. The use of the Charkha became a tool for villages in achieving progress and self-reliance. Khadi products are considered environment-friendly and are highly sought after by people not only in India but also in foreign countries. The Charkha and Khadi brought a sea-change in the rural economic scenario. This selfemployment tool for the marginalised laid the seeds of inclusive growth for the rural economy.

Bapu wanted people to lead simple lives and limit their needs. According to him, simplicity comes naturally, it cannot be cultivated. Mother Earth has enough for everyone's needs but not for their greed. The Non-Cooperation Movement of 1920 popularised Gandhian principles like Sarvodaya, Antyodaya, Self-Reliance and Non-possession for most Indians. It helped them spiritually and emotionally in dealing with several setbacks. Similarly hundred years later, when Covid-19 struck the world, Gandhiji's principles like simplicity, cleanliness and Swadeshi once again guided the nation in these difficult times. The Non-Cooperation Movement of 1920 may have started decades ago, but it taught valuable lessons not only to India, but the entire world. It inspires the world to face any difficult situation and overcome obstacles at any cost. His words "Be the change that you wish to see in the world" are still relevant and will continue to inspire generations.

Online learning provides golden opportunity for anyone to continue their education and upgrade New era is of skilled education along their skills. with traditional education. This article will focus on information about few online education portals.

1. Udemy:

Udemy is an established personal learning portal that offers courses which are inexpensive. It offers a wide range of classes on traditional educational topics as well as specific business skills, like, specific ways to use Excel for financial analysis. Ratings are provided by the past students for all of these classes.

2. Coursera:

Coursera is the biggest name in online education and courses. It offers morethan 3,900 specialized courses of various universities. Most of the services are available for free, or one can use it to earn an online degree from an a credited university. Software companies have also added many of their certification lessons and examinations to Coursera. which helps the learner with things like database management and using enterprise resource planning (ERP) tools.

3. Academic Earth:

Academic Earth is a collection of free online college courses from some of the world's leading universities and colleges. If anyone wants to ultimately create his- her own content and lesson plans, he/she can utilize what Canvas makes available in some cases. It offers courses and tools in a variety of languages.

6. Drawspace:

Drawspace offers full courses and individual lessons to the learners who are creative. It helps them to master different drawing techniques. It provides a mix of content that is free or paid. The learner can learn the basics of drawing and painting through advanced elements, drawing people, and even techniques such as creating art with tea bags or making their own colours. If anyone wants to become an artist, Drawspace includes some lesons which covers on working as a visual artist and even how to teach art to others.

7. Codecademy

Codecademy is dedicated to teaching people how to code. There are free courses as well as paid Pro Membership that offers more direct guidance and support for creating a real-world portfolio which you can use to jumpstart a freelancing career. It also offers courses on a number of languages, including PHP, Python and Ruby, and students are often already building and deploying projects by the time they finish their course.

8. Harvard Online Courses:

If anyone is interested in studying about business development or STEM (science, technology. engineering and mathematics), Harvard University has made some of its courses and special projects available online. Topics vary from the latest in

computing trends to learning how early explorers navigated using the stars or even real estate development for a post-Covid world.

Most courses include both lectures from Harvard professors and additional study materials. Every piece of audio or video content comes with a transcript to provide greater accessibility. Most courses have registration deadlines.

9. General Assembly:

General Assembly has campuses in more than 30 cities around the world with a comprehensive online education experience focusing on education in design, business, and technology. It also offers a mix of full-time and part-time classes online along with workshops, free training, and coding events. Traditionally, many of its offerings are in-person or are a mix of online and inperson options. It has added livestream and online options for every event due to the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020. It also livestreams popular lectures and provides real-time interaction with the faculty and other students. Costs varies depending on learner's choices pertaining to one-off lectures or multi-part workshops.

10. GCF Global:

The GCFLearnFree.org program is an educational tool from the Goodwill Community Foundation's (GCF) global initiative. It has been offering classes for nearly 20 years. It is primarily focused on essential business skills to help people find work. One can discover life skills around finances, freelance work, Internet and computer skills, and creative hobbies.

11. Hack Design:

Hack Design is a design course program designed to help the learner to create a career in design. Its main offering is a weekly design lesson delivered via email. Most content is free. It does not always follow a traditional course. Its faculties often come from design firms. Some lessons are put in the form of blog posts and other materials hosted on the websites of those firms. Learners can get access to talented thought leaders and new experiences, such as games to test the kerning ability.

12. HTML Dog:

HTML Dog is great platform to learn HTML. It offers free tutorials, techniques, and examples of web content in HTML, CSS, and JavaScript. HTML Dog is focused on helping the learner to get a website up and running. This option helps learner to polish the skills or get help with a specific issue experienced on a website. It doesn't dive deep into theory or feature long explanations of computer science in general.

13. Instructables:

This portal is designed specifically to showcase projects where people build physical items, including food. Learner will learn fundamental engineering and even advanced electronics. From turning old linens into ropes and old coins into rings to creating drones or coding a 3D game, there's plenty to discover.

14. iTunes U:

If learner have Apple products or an account, the company's iTunes U is a collection of courses and lectures from leading universities. With the help of part of the iTunes software courses, topic or university can be accessed. In many cases, it will be possible to get audio and video of lectures, have access to some books and materials, and even download guizzes with answer keys. Some schools now use iTunes U as part of their online classes, allowing people to ask questions and teachers to respond, plus submit work and receive grades.

15. Iversity:

Hailed as the 'Coursera of Europe', Berlin-based iversity has partnered with European and international universities to offer academic courses for free. The company has recently added certificates and verification of course completion for most of its classes, allowing students to verify course participation and learnings with an document. Costs vary and there are a few free options as well. Companies can now partner with iversity for the training of their workforce.

16. Open Culture:

Open Culture is a website which collects online education materials and supports lifelong learning with free classes, audio, and video. The non-profit looks across the Internet to find free learning resources and gathers them so they're easy for you to browse, sort, and find something you want to learn. It currently lists more than 1,500 free courses, predominantly from universities.

17. Skillcrush:

Skillcrush is a coding-focused learning company which offers free and paid classes in the area of design, user experience, digital marketing, and HTML coding. It also offers an ongoing free coding bootcamp which helps learner to learn the basics and then charges for more in-depth classes. It also provide hands-on support. It is designed for people new to computer science and coding. So there is no requirement for prior experience or a coding knowledge.

18. Skillshare:

Skillshare is a community marketplace for new skills. It has sponsored your favorite independent artists, You Tubers or podcasters. Skillshare offers an online catalogue of video-based courses as well as in-person workshops in multiple cities pertaining to a broad range of different subjects.

19. Stanford Engineering Everywhere:

Stanford Engineering Everywhere (SEE) expands the Stanford experience to students and educators online with no charge. Classes can be streamed and also downloaded. Courses are focused on engineering and include the courses taken by the majority of Stanford's undergraduates. There are also advanced options on AI and linear system optimization.

20. Udacity:

Udacity is a platform which strongly focuses on technology with well-crafted selection of courses. If you're looking to break into data science, Al, or cloud computing, Udacity's data science program has an impressive roster of teachers from companies like Salesforce and Facebook. Udacity's pricing structure allows you to pay monthly for your courses as part of what it calls a 'nano degree'. Generally, these cost \$339 per month or you can pay for multiple months at a time to save a little. Classes come with real-world projects, tech support, and career services.

Marital Blitz and the Way Forward -**A Cinematic Gaze**

Does a broken marriage empower the woman? This question comes to mind when one thinks of two landmark Hindi movies, Mahesh Bhatt's Arth (1982) and Govind Nihalani's Drishti (1990). Both are based on husband-wife relations. Marriage has always been sacred to Indians for centuries. Since India's independence, however, major changes took place in the family, social structure and in marriage as an institution. Joint families broke up into nuclear ones, giving more privacy to the couple. The mutual relations between the husband-wife changed. The notions of tolerance, patience, sacrifice, putting others' needs before oneself - these became passé. Urban couples (in particular) began to assert their freedom and dared to break the suffocating fetters. In the past, they used to fear society, their relatives, their neighbours and their elders. Now they broke free. They began to value personal goals, indulge in fantasies and seek private space in the marriage relationship.

For women, forging a career and retaining their newly found economic independence became important. The nuclear setup at home definitely helped. It gave them freedom to explore their passions and dormant talents. They dared to dream. All these changes were faithfully transported to screen by India's filmmakers. But just as cinema influenced the people, cinema also showed a mirror to society. Films were made on husband-wife relations even before the two movies of the eighties that I mentioned above: Avishkaar, Abhimaan, Duvidha (by Mani Kaul), Aandhi, Tere Mere Sapne, Kaash, Dooriyan, Humkadam, Aap ki Kasam, Mahanagar (in Bengali by Satyajit Ray). Though some did depict the rupture in the husband-wife relations, hardly did they show a spouse moving away from the family for self-gratifying or purely selfish reasons. The cause lay in societal or other circumstances, sometimes brought about by the husband himself, which forced either the wife to walk out of the relationship or vice versa - usually for a temporary period.

Why Arth and Drishti? Because here, the reason for the rupture is different. It is engineered by the husband's conscious act of physical straying. Lust and unbridled passion are the reasons he walks out on the wife and consciously terminates the marriage bond. He wants more than what the legal tie of marriage can give him. The freedom to shack up with the woman who has caught his fancy though he has no complaint against his legally wedded wife. It is a question of 'Dil maange more'.

What are the plots of the two movies? In Arth, Pooja, an orphan, marries an ambitious film director, Inder Malhotra. Emotionally and economically dependent on him, she dreams of her own home. Inder gives her the keys of that dream house only to reveal later that he is leaving as he is having an affair with the affluent actress Kavita Sanyal - a schizophrenic, neurotic and possessive woman. Pooja begs - first her husband, and then Kavita - to stop the relationship, but in vain. After a public face-off with Kavita and Inder (for the first and only time) at a party where she sees them together; Pooja, in a drunken moment, calls Kavita a 'whore' for having robbed her husband. In a candid moment the following day, Inder returns to 'inform' Pooja that the house she is so proud of has actually been financed by Kavita. After this scathing revelation, refusing to live on the charity of her husband's mistress, Pooja decides to leave the house.

The sub theme is of Pooja's maid, a survivor of domestic violence with an alcoholic husband who has his own mistress. Despite all this, Bai (the maid) is trying to educate her little daughter in the hope of a better future. Her words encourage Pooja to leave her home and move to a women's hostel. Pooja gets

a job, and tries to make a life for herself. She finds a good friend in Raj, a ghazal singer, who she had met at the party. Her childhood friend Aparna and her lawyer husband Arvind too provide emotional support to Pooja. Though Inder and Kavita are in a live-in relation, she forces Inder to get a divorce. However, unable to bear the guilt of stealing him from Pooja, she undergoes a breakdown and eventually casts him off.

The maid, in the meanwhile, kills her alcoholic husband when she finds that he has stolen her money (a substantial amount) which she had been saving for her daughter's education - and surrenders to the police. She hands over her daughter to Pooja, asking her to educate the little one. Inder now returns to Pooja, begging for a second chance - which Pooja refuses. She no longer needs him. She has a job and a child to look after, and most importantly, her self-respect. Though Raj professes his love for her, Pooja refuses to settle down with anybody else. She recognises her identity as a complete woman not a commodity any longer. She chooses to stay single & independent - and to mother her maid's daughter.

In Drishti, Sandhya and Nikhil are a happily married, urban, professional couple. Coming from middleclass families, they have risen in their professional life by virtue of merit and hard work. On their eighth wedding anniversary, they throw a party - at which, one of their friends brings his nephew Rahul, who is a classical singer. Sandhya is attracted to him and has a brief affair with him. She confides in her friend Prabha; but does not tell Nikhil about it. After a couple of months, the affair ends. Sandhya conceives. While she is confused whether to give birth to the child or not, Nikhil is quite clear he does not want an addition to the family. But there is a miscarriage. After about a year, Nikhil who has fallen in love with Vrinda (his office lab assistant), tells Sandhya about it and leaves her. Sandhya is shattered. Four years after the divorce they meet again, and Sandhya mentions her affair with Rahul. Why were these movies pioneering? Why did they break the mould and became epochs in their time? Arth definitely was a pathbreaker. Moreover, they won National Awards. There are close similarities between them (for obvious reasons) - both have husbands who jump the fence. Their subject matter is marriage and relationships outside it.

The protagonist pairs belong to affluent homes. Though they have worked their way up in life, they enjoy a particular standard of living. In the beginning, there is a slight tentativeness in both Pooja and Sandhya, which changes later. Both women crumble when they hear their husbands utter the devastating words. Pooja, a housewife who grew up as an orphan (with only her friend Aparna as a go-to person for the smallest problem), entirely depends on her husband for both, emotional and financial support. She evolves into a strong, independent and confident working woman cum adoptive mother only after her suburban marital bliss ends in a blitz. In contrast, Sandhya, is a working woman from the beginning. Though an editor in a publishing house, she also is appalled by her husband's firm and inflexible decision to exit from her life. But when he asks to return, on the eve of their divorce, she tells him she realised - rather slowly - that she was free of "the flotsam that had built" between them of "hatred, pain, (and) of displeasing" him. Her final stand "I am above thirty. I have a daughter. And this is the only reality for me" is too close to Pooja's words to Raj in the last scene, for a discerning viewer to miss. "I have got the opportunity to be a(n adoptive) mother. After having Malhotra legally removed from my name, I am now completely myself. The realisation that I belong only to myself is too strong and precious to let go. Your bond of love will make me weak again." (Pooja's words).

Both women are dreamers. Pooja dreams of owning her own apartment. Sandhya is imaginative and poetic, in that, the first rain showers always ignite her imagination and her refrain at both the beginning and the end of the movie is "Kitna sundar hai na?" (How beautiful it is). After plumbing the depths of despair, each female protagonist emerges as a woman of grit, mettle, and fortitude. Another common point between these movies is the fact that the ghost of the wife remains, as it were, between the infidelous husband and his mistress. Just as Pooja becomes the crease between the separate sides of a bed that Inder and Kavita share, in a frank moment of truthsharing, Nikhil recalls T. S. Eliot's poem which talks about a third figure walking between a pair. He tells Sandhya that she is the third person ever present between Vrinda and himself. Thus, the infidelous pair can never shake off their guilt of how they have wounded another being.

A unique thread that runs through these movies is the bond of friendship. In Arth, Pooja has Aparna (her childhood friend) and her lawyer husband Arvind at first, to provide emotional succour. It is important to note that Inder does not enter this haloed circle. (not even when he comes to apologise to Pooja; he opts to stay outside) It is Pooja's private reserve. Pooja is blessed to get yet another dependable friend, and admirer, in Raj - who subsequently proposes marriage. In her worst moments, he offers a crutch. He has seen her stoop to her lowest - when she throws dignity to the winds in the drunken moment at the party, Raj firmly hustles her out of the clutches of the pawing predators. He helps Pooja get a job and devises a home-made party for her on the day Inder callously asks her to sign the divorce papers - totally disregarding the fact that it is her birthday. Raj remains steadfast and understanding even when Pooja refuses his proposal and decides to foot it alone in life, armed with the new found confidence he had always urged her to garner.

Drishti offers a very unique take on friendship. Sandhya is blessed to have a confidante and true friend in Prabha whose marriage with Ramesh is also on the rocks. This pair provides a foil to Nikhil and Sandhya whose marriage seems on-track at that point in time. Prabha becomes Sandhya's inspiration when Nikhil leaves her. When her marriage also founders, Prabha starts a boutique on her own steam, taking not a penny from the niggardly and chauvinistic Ramesh who has scant respect for his wife. Their arranged marriage, though valid on paper, is a sham in reality. Whereas, Nikhil's relationship with Sandhya is markedly different. Even after exiting from her life, the two are bound by a unique tie of friendship. Over coffee, they converse with each other at length, discuss their marriage at every point, analyse why and where it went wrong, the confusions and suffocation they felt when they were with each other, how Nikhil could never reach out to 'that Sandhya' who had insulated herself from expressing her feelings - in other words, the mature and dependable wife versus the scared and vulnerable Vrinda (his invisible much younger mistress). Interestingly, when Nikhil meets her on the eve of obtaining the divorce, they have a fleeting intimate moment!! To his own utter amazement, in the course of these friendly discussions, Nikhil discovers why he strayed. He realises that Vrinda reminds him of the much younger Sandhya. Thus, he was looking for the younger Sandhya of their courtship days (which he sees in Vrinda.) The Sandhya of today is a mature version of the old youthful girl who has been left behind forever nine years back in time.

Contrast the Pooja-Inder of Arth and this pair of Drishti. In that movie, there is no place for friendship between the couple, once Inder crosses the threshold of Pooja's dream house. Within eight years, from Arth (1982) to Drishti

(1990), Indian film makers showed that couples in India were looking at divorce from another lens. While Arth concentrated on the emancipation and self-esteem of the discarded wife, Drishti focussed on the notion that friendship is still possible in a fractured marriage. The signature on the divorce papers need not dent their friendship. This is a new possibility - a change in their relationship.

While Inder's friendship with Kavita is pure lust and unbridled passion, there is a similar transgression in Drishti, between Sandhya and Rahul. Sandhya too, is no saint. When she eventually tells Nikhil about her affair with Rahul, four years after her marriage ends, the audience wonders about the need for it. We also share Nikhil's doubt whether the foetus that Sandhya miscarried was really Nikhil's. After all, she too had transgressed. So, her indignation at what Nikhil did to her and his lack of understanding about it, seems hollow as she also has kept a secret from her husband. A transgression is a transgression - however brief and unimportant it may have been to Sandhya at that point of time. The question the viewer asks is if it was so unimportant to her why did she enjoy it so much as she is even telling Prabha about it. And why did she do it? Just like Kavita and Inder, Sandhya too did get carried away by unbridled passion - however brief. Her rationale is totally unconvincing.

The space that Nikhil and Sandhya keep talking about - that they had not had in their own marriage (because of too much honesty) seems to change its form - and become an eternal friendship between them even after their divorce. The audience notes that this pair has no objection with 'so much honesty' after their divorce which they did before! To the extent that the last scene of Drishti too shows the estranged couple feeling completely comfortable in conversing with each other. Though they have charted parallel lives for themselves, the desire to confide in the ex-spouse and share pictures, news and information, is a novel feature of Drishti. It showed that friendship is possible even in a failed marriage. They don't shut the door on friendship ever. Thus, Bollywood movies moved on in their depiction of how a marriage can end in the eighties' decade.


Are they replaced? If yes, then how does that affect the reading habits of a reader?







How does Fasting work?

Does fasting help to lose weight? How long should I do it? Can I get the result in 1 month? These are the least questions that pop up when your mind thinks about fasting. Let's know it bit by bit! Now, there are many variations in fasting like juice fasting, vegetable fasting, intermittent fasting, and so on... But the main aim of fasting is to give time to your wonderful body to detoxify, cleanse, and heal itself. This process of detoxifying, cleansing and healing will only happen after the body is done digesting your food. Why should you give time to your body? Your sleeping time should be enough, right? Wrong!

Digestion time varies among individuals and between men and women. After you eat, it takes about six to eight hours for food to pass through your stomach and small intestine. Food then enters your large intestine (colon) for further digestion, absorption of water, and, finally, elimination of undigested food. It takes about 36 hours for food to move through the entire colon. In all, the whole process — from the time you swallow food to the time it leaves your body as feces - takes about two to five days, depending on the individual. Oh, so longgg, that's the truth! Think of fruits as bikes (easily digested), vegetables as cars (average time required), and heavy foods like grains, pulses, beans, meat as trucks (more time required) on a highway.

Today it has become a new normal to eat in excess, having 5-6 meals, snacking aimlessly, doing food challenges just to feel pleasure but your stomach hates it... Generally, human stomachs have a volume of about one litre and can stretch up to 4 litres but please don't abuse your stomach, you'll need it for a long time! If fasting is difficult for you as it is more than 24 hours and it can

go long, you can start with a juice fast having only vegetable juices (not fruit juice), then move toward intermittent (partial day) fasting where you have an eating and fasting window, it can be '10 hours eating:14 hours fasting' or '8 hours eating: 16 hours fasting', there are many variations to it. It is not a mammoth task at all because if you're sleeping for 8-10 hours, you're already fasting and gradually you can add more hours to it till you can fast full-fledged for 24 hours or more.

Anyone can say it easily, right? But action speaks louder than words. I've been doing intermittent fasting for more than 18 months now. Not to lose weight, not to look attractive, not to impress others but I wanted to get rid of the consistent headache problem that I had... that lead me to discover this amazing lifestyle and I can't even think of giving up the idea of fasting! I love it because it gives me the willpower to refuse the food when not necessary, it makes me feel confident and it helps to grow minimalism in me.

I extremely extend my gratitude to those who shared their knowledge with the world on YouTube and let others too experience it. I don't do fasting as I comparatively eat in less quantity so I have extended Intermittent Fasting (IF) hours every day. I rarely go for 1 day unless required. And ideally, fasting can be done once in a fortnight or week but there is no risk in doing IF every day. It's an individual's choice. Please do consult your, physician, before! Don't rush with anything, it takes time for your body to adapt to new habits and lifestyles. I forgot to tell you one more thing, it makes you learn patience! Happy Fasting.

अल्बेर्ट आइनस्टाइन जो ४ साल की उम्र तक कुछ बोल नहीं पता था और ७ साल की उम्र तक निरक्षर था । लोग उसको दिमागी रूप से कमजोर मानते थे लेकिन अपनी थ्यौरी और सिद्धांतों के बल पर वो दुनिया का सबसे बडा साइंटिस्ट बना । अब ज़रा सोचो कि अगर हेनरी फ़ोर्ड पाँच बिज़नेस में फेल होने के बाद निराश होकर बैठ जाता, या एडिसन ९९९ असफल प्रयोग के बाद उम्मीद छोड़ देता और आइनस्टाइन भी खुद को दिमागी कमजोर मान के बैठ जाता तो क्या होता ?

ऑनलाईन+ऑफलाईन = उद्याचे शिक्षण

ऑनलाईन आणि ऑफलाईन यांचे सुयोग्य मिश्रण असलेली 'संमिश्र शिक्षण पद्धत' (Blended Learning) ही भविष्यातील महत्वाची शिक्षण पद्भत असे आजचे चित्र आहे. सध्या कोरोनाच्या जागतिक संकटामुळे शाळा बंद आहेत. शाळा सुरु करण्याजोगी परिस्थिती कधी निर्माण होईल, हे आज सांगता येणे कठीण आहे. शाळा सुरु झाल्याच तरी, सामाजिक अंतराचे नियम काय असतील आणि ते पाळून शाळा पूर्ववत चालवता येतील का, हेही सांगता येणे कठीण आहे. सरकारने शाळा 'ऑनलाईन' सुरु करायला परवानगी दिली आहे. अनेक शाळांनी कोणत्या ना कोणत्या पद्धतीचे, ऑनलाईन उपक्रम सुरु देखील केले आहेत. पण, या सार्याची पुढील दिशा काय असेल? याचा विचार गांभीर्याने करायला हवा. आपल्याकडे मोबाईल, लॅपटॉप अशी उपकरणे वापरून, आपण अनेक गोष्टी करतो. पण या माध्यमांचा वापर करून शाळा किंवा कोणत्याही प्रकारचे शैक्षणिक उपक्रम चालवणे, हे आपल्यासाठी पूर्णपणे नवीन आहे. कोरोनामुळे लादल्या गेलेल्या सक्तीच्या सुट्टीमुळे हे ऑनलाइन शिक्षणाचे माध्यम एकाएकीच वपरात आले. पण या ऑनलाईन शिक्षणाची आजची परिस्थिती काय आहे? त्यासाठी कोणते पर्याय उपलब्ध आहेत? ते आज कोणत्या प्रकारे वापरले जात आहेत? या सगळ्याचे भविष्य काय असेल? या प्रश्नांचा उहापोह करताना, सर्वात महत्त्वाचे म्हणजे या सार्यातून आपल्याला नक्की काय साध्य करायचे आहे? ते समजून घ्यायला हवे.

शिक्षणाचे घटक

साधारणतः शिक्षणाचे तीन प्रमुख घटक असतात. अध्यापन (teaching), अध्ययन (learning) आणि मूल्यमापन (evaluation) या तीन घटकांसाठी शिक्षणप्रक्रिया राबविली जाते. आता हे तीनही घटक या नव्या ऑनलाईन पद्धतीत करो आकार घेतील ते पाह्या. अध्यापन (training)- शिक्षक वर्गाम ध्ये शिकवितात ते अध्यापन. यामध्ये शिक्षकाचे व्यक्तिगत कौशल्य, वक्तृत्व, विषय मांडण्याची आणि समजावून सांगण्याची कला हे अंतर्भूत असते. अध्ययन (learning) - विद्यार्थी स्वतःच्या प्रयत्न आणि आकलनाने जे शिकतात ते अध्ययन. यामध्ये शिक्षकांनी सांगितलेली अभ्यास सामग्री (study material) वाचणे, संबंधित अध्ययन (learning resources) बघणे / अनुभवणे, दिलेला गृहपाठ (homework/assignments) करणे यांचा समावेश असतो. मूल्यमापन (evaluation) -

अध्यापन आणि अध्ययनातून विद्यार्थी किती शिकला आहे, याची पडताळणी करणे म्हणजे मूल्यमापन. यामध्ये गृहपाठाची तपासणी करणे, घटक चाचण्या घेणे आणि परीक्षा घेणे यांचा सम ावेश असतो. ऑनलाईन शिक्षणाचा विचार करताना, हे तीनही घटक ऑनलाईन माध्यमांमधून पूर्ण करता येतील अशी व्यवस्था किंवा प्रणाली वापरायला हवी.

सध्याची परिस्थिती

सध्याची परिस्थिती बघता बहुसंख्य शाळा अथवा शिक्षक फक्त 'अध्यापन' ऑनलाईन करण्यावर भर देत आहेत, असे दिसून येते. झूम किंवा गूगल मीट सारखे तंत्रज्ञान वापरून शिक्षक आणि विद्यार्थ्यांचा व्हिडियो कॉल सेटअप करणे आणि त्यात शिक्षक वर्गात शिकवितात, त्याप्रमाणे शिकवणे अशी सध्याच्या बहुसंख्य ऑनलाईन वर्गांची परिस्थिती दिसत आहे. काही कल्पक शिक्षक आपल्या लेक्चरचे पॉवरपॉइंट प्रेझेंटेशन करून, ते व्हिडियो कॉलवर दाखवतात आणि विषय समजावून सांगतात. काही शिक्षक फळा समोर ठेवून, त्यावर वर्गात शिकवत असल्यासारखे खडूने मुद्दे लिहुन शिकवतात. शिक्षकांचे सर्व प्रशिक्षण हे वर्गात शिकवण्याच्या दुष्टीने झालेले असताना आणि वर्गात शिकवण्याचाच अनुभव त्यांच्यापाशी असताना अचानक ऑनलाईन अध्यापन करावे लागणे, हा त्यांच्यासाठी प्रचंड मोठा बदल आहे. यासाठी त्यांचे प्रशिक्षण झालेले नाही (किंवा अगदी कमी वेळात तशी तयारी त्यांना करावी लागली आहे).

दुसर्या घटकाचा, अध्ययनाचा, विचार केला, तर त्यासाठी आज प्रामुख्याने पारंपारिक साधने आणि पद्धतीच वापरल्या जात आहेत. अध्ययनाचे पारंपारिक साधन म्हणजे पाठ्यपुरतक आणि पद्धत म्हणजे पुरतकातले धंडे वाचून त्याखालची प्रश्नोत्तरे सोडवणे. खरेतर कोणताही विषय शिकण्यासाठी आजच्या ऑनलाईन जगात प्रचंड मोठ्या प्रमाणावर रिसोस स उपलब्ध आहेत. युट्यूबवरचे व्हिडियोज, विकिपीडियासारखे माहितीचे संग्रह इथपासून ते अनंत ब्लॉग्ज आणि माहितीचे संकलन करणार्या वेबासाईट्स उपलब्ध आहेत. असे असताना अध्ययनासाठी फक्त पाठ्यपुरतकावर अवलंबून रहाणे, हे शिक्षण मर्यादित चाकोरीमध्ये अडकवून ठेवण्यासारखे आहे. काही शाळांमधले काही शिक्षक, अशी साधने (रिसोर्सेस) वापरायला मुलांना प्रोत्साहन देत आहेत, मात्र बहुसंख्य ठिकाणी ऑनलाईन माध्यमाचा प्रभावी वापर करून, अध्ययन पाठ्यपुरतकापलिकडे नेण्याचा प्रयत्न होणे गरजेचे आहे.

मुल्यमापनाची पारंपारिक पद्धत म्हणजे वेळोवेळी घेतल्या गेलेल्या चाचण्या आणि परीक्षा. छोट्या चाचण्यांसाठी ऑनलाईन माध्यमांमध्ये स्पर्धा (Quiz), सर्वेक्षण (Survey) किंवा मतचाचणी (Polls) सारखी तंत्र वापरता येऊ शकतात किंवा गूगल फॉर्मस वापरान मुलांकडून प्रश्नोत्तरे मागवता येऊ शकतात. सध्या मात्र मूल्यमापनासाठी कागद-पेन या पारंपारिक साधनांचाच वापर होताना दिसत आहे. शिक्षकांनी प्रश्नोत्तरे स्कॅन करून पाठवणे, त्याचा प्रिटेआउट काढून त्यावर ती सोडवणे आणि ते स्कॅन करून शिक्षकांना परत पाठवणे किंवा वहीत प्रश्नोत्तरे लिहुन, त्याचा फोटो शिक्षकांना पाठवणे हे बहुसंख्य ठिकाणी केले जाताना दिसत आहे. एकूणात, अध्यापन, अध्ययन आणि मूल्यमापन या शिक्षणाच्या तीन अंगांपैकी प्रामुख्याने अध्यापन ऑनलाईन केले जाताना दिसत आहे.

ऑनलाईन शिक्षणाचे फायदे

ऑनलाईन शिक्षणाच्या प्रणालीची अत्यंत प्रभावीपणे अंमलबजावणी झाली तर, त्याचा अनेक स्तरांवर फायदा होऊ शकतो. ज्ञानदानासाठी किंवा क्षमताविकसनासाठी, एका शारिरिक वयाच्या ५०-१०० मूलांना एका छताखाली रोज जमवुन, त्यांना एकाच पद्धतीचे शिक्षण देणे ही औद्योगिक काळाची (Industrial Age) ची गरज होती. केवळ त्याच पद्धतीने शिक्षण देणे तेव्हा शक्य होते. पण अगदी कोरोना येण्यापूर्वीपर्यंत या परिस्थितीत काहीसा फरक पडला नव्हता. कोरोनाच्या या झटक्याने आपण अचानक नव्या पद्धतीत आलो आहोत.

भविष्यात या नव्या ऑनलाईन शिक्षण पद्धतीत प्रत्येकासाठी व्यक्तिगत शिक्षणाचे नियोजन (लर्निंग प्लॅन), शिक्षणाचा मार्ग (लर्निंग पाथ) असू शकतात. वयानुसार आणि व्यक्तिगत क्षमतेनुसार त्या नियोजनामध्ये लवचिकता येऊ शकते. म्हणजे दहा वर्षांचे एक मूल त्याच्या नैसर्गिक क्षम तेनुसार, चौथीचे तर दुसरे मूल त्याच्या क्षमतेनुसार सातवी-आठवीचे गणित शिकू शकते. हे आज घडत नाही, पण उद्या कदाचित असे घडू शकेल. प्रत्येकजण आपापल्या क्षमतेनुसार आणि आवडीनिवडीनुसार आपल्या शिक्षणाचा मार्ग निवडू शकेल.

शाळा चालवण्यासाठी शाळेच्या इमारती, मैदाने यांचे इन्फ्रास्ट्रक्चर लागते. शहरांपासून ते खेड्यांपर्यंत प्रत्येक मुलाच्या घराजवळ शाळा हवी असेल तर त्यासाठी लागू शकणार्या इन्फ्रस्टक्चरसाठी महाकाय गुंतवणूक करावी लागते. शाळा घराजवळ नसेल तर, मुलांच्या वाहतुकीची व्यवस्था आणि त्यासंबंधी इन्फ्रस्ट्रक्चर लागते. वाहतुकीमध्ये मुलांचा जाणारा वेळ आणि त्या दरम्यानच्या त्यांच्या सुरक्षिततेचा प्रश्न ही देखील एक मोठी समस्या असते. अत्यंत प्रभावीपणे चालवल्या गेलेल्या ऑनलाईन शिक्षणामुळे या समस्यांचे निराकरण होऊ शकते. शाळांच्या इन्प्रक्रटूक्चरमध्ये मोठ्या प्रम ाणावर गुंतवणूक न करता, शिक्षण सर्वदूर पोहोचवता येऊ शकते.

ऑनलाईन शिक्षणाच्या मर्याटा

शाळांमध्ये मुले पारंपारिक शिक्षणासोबत सामाजिक वर्तन (सोशल स्किल्स) सुद्धा शिकत असतात. कोणत्याही व्यक्तीच्या जडणघडणीमध्ये तो जिथे शिकतो तिथल्या वातावरणाचा, संगतीचा आणि सोशल स्किल्सचा अत्यंत महत्वाचा वाटा असतो. पूर्णपणे ऑनलाईन असलेल्या शिक्षण पद्धतीमध्ये मुलांनी आपल्या समवयीन मुलांमध्ये गटाने एकत्र रहाणे, एकमेकांशी मैत्री करणे, मैदानात एकत्र खेळणे, दंगामस्ती करणे इत्यादी गोष्टी घडत नाहीत. या सगळ्यातून आपोआप शिकले जाणारे सामाजिक वर्तनाचे नियम, सामाजिक शिस्त आणि संबंधित सोशल स्किल्स ही ऑनलाईन शिक्षणातून देता येत नाहीत. ऑनलाईन शिक्षणाची ही सगळ्यांत मोठी मर्यादा आहे.

शालेय शिक्षणात काही उपक्रम हे प्रत्यक्ष उपस्थित राहून आणि शिक्षकांच्या देखरेखीखालीच करावे लागतात. प्रयोगशाळांमध्ये केलेले प्रयोग हे याचे ठळक उदाहरण आहे. अशा प्रकारचे प्रयोगशाळांमधून दिले जाणारे शिक्षण ऑनलाईन माध्यमांमधून देता येणे अत्यंत अवघड, कदाचित अशक्य आहे. याचबरोबर, ऑनलाईन शिक्षणासाठी शिक्षक आणि विद्यार्थी दोघांकडेही पुरेशा क्षमतेची तांत्रिक उपकरणे (स्मार्टफोन्स, टॅब्लेट्स, लॅपटॉप्स इत्यादी) आणि प्रेशी बँडविडथ असलेले आणि सतत सुरु असलेले हाय स्पीड इंटरनेट असणे गरजेचे असते. यातली पुरेशा क्षमतेची तांत्रिक उपकरणे सर्व विद्यार्थी आणि शिक्षकांकडे असतातच, त्यांना ती परवडतातच असे नाही. ग्रामीण भाग, शहरी कनिष्ठ आणि निम्नमध्यमवर्ग सोडा, अगदी मध्यमवर्ग आणि उच्च मध्यमवर्गातही मुलांना त्यांच्या मालकीचा रमार्टफोन किंवा लॅपटॉप देणे सगळ्यांनाच शक्य नसते. याच बरोबर सर्वदूर पोटोचलेली, सदैव उपलब्ध असलेली पुरेशी इंटरनेट कनेक्टिविटी ही आपल्याकडची मोठी समस्या आहे. मोबाईलच्या 3G/4G सेवा काही ठिकाणी जोमात चालतात तर काही ठिकाणी केवळ नावाला उपलब्ध असतात. वायर्ड ब्रॉडबॅंड आणि फायबर ऑप्टिक जिथे आहेत तिथे कमालीचे चालतात, जिथे नाहीत तिथे कधी पोचतील सांगता येत नाही. म्हणजे ऑनलाईन शिक्षण ज्यावर मिळतं ती उपकरणे हातात नाहीत आणि ज्याद्वारे मिळते त्या कनेक्टिविटीची खात्री नाही, अशी बहुसंख्य विद्यार्थांची अवस्था आहे.

संमिश्र शिक्षण हीच भविष्याची दिशा

ऑनलाईन शिक्षण व्यवस्था ही काळाची गरज आहे. अत्यंत कमी खर्चात प्रत्येक विद्यार्थ्यापर्यंत पोहोच् शकेल, आणि प्रत्येकाला आपापल्या आवड आणि क्षमतेनुसार घेता येईल असे शिक्षण खरोखर महत्वाचे आहे. मात्र, ऑनलाईन शिक्षणाच्या काही महत्वाच्या मर्यादांमुळे पारंपारिक शालेय शिक्षण आणि शाळांना तो संपूर्ण पर्याय ठरेलच असे नाही. संमिश्र शिक्षण पद्धत (Blended L>earning) ही भविष्यातली महत्वाची शिक्षण पद्धत असेल. जे विषय ऑनलाईन शिकता येणे शक्य आहे त्यांचे अध्यापन-अध्ययन ऑनलाईन होणे. जे विषय प्रत्यक्ष एकत्र येऊनच शिकावे लागतात त्यासाठी शाळांसारख्या संस्थांमध्ये एकत्र येणे, अशा दोन्ही पद्धतीचा वापर येणा□्या काळात करावा लागेल. त्याचबरोबर मूल्यमापनाच्या पद्धतीमध्ये प्रमाणीकरण करून त्या ऑनलाईन पद्धतीने राबवल्या तर देशातल्या कोणालाही कुठूनही हव्या त्या अभ्यासक्रमाची परीक्षा देता येणे शक्य होईल.

या सर्व एखाद दुसर्या वर्षात घडणार्या गोष्ठी नाहीत. वर्षानुवर्षे अनेक सरकारी आणि खासगी संस्थांनी एकमेकांशी समन्वय साधत प्रयतन केले तर संपूर्णपणे आधुनिक आणि सर्वांना उपलब्ध अशी नवी शिक्षण व्यवस्था आपण उभी करू शकू.

नैसर्गिक आनंद आणि आत्म-प्रेमाच्या आहारी जाण्याची इच्छा मागे टाकून जग अत्यंत रूपर्धात्मक बनले आहे. जेव्हा प्रेम आधीच आपल्याबरोबर राहत असते तेव्हा आपण बर्याचदा इतरांमध्ये प्रेम शोधू लागतो. आपण गुणांऐवजी राशीवर लक्ष केंद्रित केल्यामुळे जीवनाचे स्वर आता मधुर राहिलेले नाहीत. तुम्ही 'एकट्याने स्वतःला किती आनंद देईल' यापेक्षा 'इतर काय म्हणतील किंवा विचार करतील' यावर लक्ष केंद्रित करता. हे खरे आहे की लोक न शोधलेल्यांचा शोध घेण्यासाठी आणि लपलेल्या गोष्टीचा उलगडा करण्यासाठी उंदरांची शर्यत चालवतात आणि सीमांच्या पलीकडे जाऊन सहज उपलब्ध नसलेल्या किंवा प्राप्त न झालेल्या गोष्टीची खात्री देतात. पण हेही खरं आहे की, इतरांना खूश करण्यासाठी आपण आपल्या भावना आणि विशिष्ट गुणांकडे दुर्लक्ष करतो. हीच ती वेळ आहे जेव्हा तुम्ही स्वतःला विचारलं पाहिजे, 'मी खूश आहे का? इतरांची कामगिरी अधिक चांगली करण्याचा उत्साह मला मिळेल का?' जर उत्तर 'होय' असेल, तर आपण यशस्वीरित्या स्वतः वर, आपल्या आनंदावर लक्ष केंद्रित केले आहे आणि शक्य तितके सर्वोत्तम बाहेर आणले आहे. देवाने प्रतिस्पर्ध्यांना तुमच्यातील सर्वोत्तम गोष्टी बाहेर काढण्यासाठी बनवले आहे, तर मग शेवटचा परिणाम इतका समाधानकारक असेल की तुम्ही कायमचे जगू शकाल.

किती छोटा शब्द ना जो श्वासाप्रमाणे जपणे आवश्यक आहे. तोच विश्वास असतो, आणि म्हणूनच त्याला विश्वास म्हणत असावे. कदाचित जशी श्वासाची हमी नाही कि तो केव्हा बंद होईल तसेच हुली विश्वासाचे झालेले आहे, कोण कधी त्मचा विश्वास तोडेल याचा ही काहीच नेम नाही. आपण एखाद्यावर विश्वास ठेवतो म्हणजे काय करतो, तर ही व्यक्ती मला कधीच फरावणार नाही, कधी आणि कुठल्याच परिस्थितीत दगा देणार नाही, याची आपल्या मनाशी खुणगाठ बांधून ठेवतो, आपण विश्वास ठेवतो म्हणजे आपणसम ोरच्याच्या तुम्ही जेव्हा या जगाचा निरोप घ्याल तेव्हा तुमच्या आयुष्यातल्या अशा व्यक्तीची संख्या मोजा, ज्यांनी तुम्ही विश्वास हे विविध वस्तूंशी, व्यक्तीशी, अन्य प्राण्यांशी, विचारप्रणालीशी, मूल्यांशी, तत्त्वांशी किंवा अद्भूत, कल्पित मानल्या जाणार्या विषयांशीही जडणारे भावनात्मक नाते आहे. 'ईश्वराच्या अस्तित्वावर माझा विश्वास आहे'. 'त्या माणसाच्या प्रामाणिकपणावर माझा विश्वास आहे', 'तुम्ही निश्चितपणे विजयी व्हाल, असा मला विश्वास वाटतो', अशी वा अशा प्रकारची विधाने दैनंदिन जीवनात आपण अनेकदा ऐकतो. त्यांचा आशय लक्षात घेतला, तर 'विश्वास' ह्या शब्दाचा अर्थ 'खात्री', 'श्रद्धा' ह्या शब्दांच्या अर्थाजवळ येतो. असे दिसून येईल. विशेषतः ईश्वराच्या अस्तित्वावरील विश्वासाला 'श्रद्धा' हाच शब्द साम ान्यतः वापरला जातो.

विश्वास निर्माण करणारे काही घटक व्यक्तिम नाच्या बाहेरचे, तर काही व्यक्तीमनातले असतात. व्यक्तिमनाच्या बाहेरचे जे घटक असतात, त्यांत निरनिराज्या स्त्रोतांपासून मिळालेली माहिती हा घटक विशेष महत्त्वाचा होय. उदा. दूरदर्शन, वर्तमानपत्रे ह्यांसारख्या प्रसारम ाध्यमांतून जे संदेश पुन्हा पुन्हा दिले जातात, ते त्यांच्या प्रभावी सूचनक्षमतेमुळे त्यांच्यावरील विश्वास उत्पन्न करतात. उदा. दूरदर्शनवरील विविध उत्पादनांच्या जाहिराती. त्या पाहून ती उत्पादने अत्यंत दर्जेदार आणि खात्रीलायक गुणवत्तेची असली पाहिजेत असा विश्वास कित्येकांच्या म नात निर्माण होऊ शकतो. तसेच वर्तमानपत्रांतून प्रसिद्ध झालेली वृत्तेही शंभर टक्के विश्वसनीय म्हणून अनेक लोक स्वीकारीत असतात.

प्रत्यक्ष अनुभवामुळेही विश्वास निर्माण होतो. एखाद्या व्यक्तीच्या प्रामाणिकपणावरील इतरांचा विश्वास हा त्या व्यक्तीच्या प्रामाणिकपणाचा नेहमीच अनुभव येत गेल्यामुळे निर्माण झालेला असतो. अशा व्यक्तींनी पुरविलेल्या माहितीवरही विश्वास टाकला जातो. तथापि कधी कधी वृत्त पुरविणारी व्यक्ती वा माध्यम खात्रीलायक नसतेही. परंत् त्या स्त्रोतापासून वा सूत्रापासून मिळालेली माहिती ज्यांच्या सोयीची असते. त्यांचा तिच्यावर त्वरित विश्वास बसतो. काही व्यक्तीची एक विशिष्ट प्रतिमा निरनिराळ्या प्रसारमाध्यमांतून निर्माण करण्यात आलेली असते. त्या व्यक्ती प्रत्यक्षात कशा आहेत, ह्याचा काहीच अनुभव नसताना तीच प्रतिमा विश्वासार्ह म्हणून स्वीकारण्याची सर्वसाम ान्य माणसांची वृत्ती असते. एखादी राजकीय विचारप्रणालीही प्रसारमाध्यमांद्वारे केल्या जाणार्या परिणामकारक प्रचारातून लोकहिताची कशी आहे हे दाखवून तिच्यासंबंधी लोकांचा विश्वास निर्माण केला जातो.

अनेक लोक दीर्घकाळ जे करीत आले, ते इष्ट्य असले पाहिजे ह्या विश्वासाम्ळेच अनेक पारंपरिक चालीरीती कोणतीही चिकित्सा न करता स्वीकारल्या जातात. धर्मग्रंथांतील प्रत्येक वचनावरील विश्वास हा ह्याच पद्धतीने निर्माण द्यालेला असतो.

विश्वास निर्माण करणारे काही घटक व्यक्तिमनाच्या बाहेर जसे असतात, तसे काही व्यक्तिमनातही असतात. आपल्या परिसरातील घटकांना सर्व व्यक्ती सारख्याच पद्धतीने प्रतिक्रिया देत नाहीत. व्यक्तीचे वय, तिची मानसिक वाढ, तिचा अनुभव, तिच्या व्यक्तिमत्वातील परिपक्सा अशा अनेक घटकांवर त्या - त्या व्यक्तीची प्रतिक्रिया अवलंबुन असते. त्यामुळे विविध व्यक्तीच्या विश्वासांचे जगही वेगवेगळे असते. उदा. आईवडील, शिक्षक ह्यांची मते लहान मुले चिकित्सा न करता खरी म्हणून विश्वासाने स्वीकारतात. त्याचप्रमाणे विचार करण्याची जबाबदारी टाळणारे काही प्रौढही इतर जे काही सांगतात, ते सर्व विश्वासाई मानून त्यांच्या मतांवर विश्वासाने अवलंबून राहुतात. मानसिक रुग्णांच्या मनात वस्तुस्थितीशी विसंगत अशा प्रकारचे अनेक विश्वास निर्माण होतात. तथापि ह्या प्रकारच्या विश्वासाला संध्रम ही संज्ञा योग्य ठरते. काही मनोविकृत स्वतःला राजा, सर्वसत्तावंत, परमेश्वर मानतात. तर काही मनोरूग्ण खतःला पापी, गुन्हेगार समजतात.

विश्वास ठेवणे आणि शास्त्रीय पुराव्यांनी सिद्ध झालेल्या वस्तुस्थितीचा स्वीकार करणे ह्यांत फरक करावा लागेल. उदा., 'पृथ्वी गोल आहे, ह्यावर माझा विश्वास आहे' असे म्हणणे चम त्कारिक ठरेल. 'विश्वास' हा वाय-फायसारखा असतो. दृष्टीस पडत नाही, दिसत नाही, पण तो तुम्हाला जे पाहिजे आहे, त्याच्याशी जोडून देतो. विश्वास म्हणजे काय? एखादी व्यक्ती आपल्याला कधीही फराविणार नाही, आपले वाईट चिंतणार नाही, करणार नाही, आपल्याशी नेहमी प्रामाणिक असेलही त्या व्यक्तीविषयीची भावना म्हणजे

'विश्वास'. ती व्यक्ती आई, वडील, बहीण, भाऊ, मित्र-मैत्रीण, नातेवाईक कोणीही अस् शकते. अगदी नोकरसुद्धा. आपल्याला असलेली एक वाईट सवय म्हणजे, घरातील एखादी अगदी शुक्क वस्तू जरी सापडत नसेल तर ती नोकराने उचलली असेल, हा संशय मनात प्रथम येऊन जातो. ते बरेचदा खोटे ठरते. एका अतिशय श्रीमंत कुटुंबात सरुमावशी अठरा एकोणीस वर्षे काम करत होती. आपल्या चार वर्षांच्या मुलाला कडेवर घेऊन काम शोधणार्या सरुला या कुटुंबाने काम दिले, थारा दिला. सुरुवातीला तिच्यावर प्रत्येक जण लक्ष ठेवून असायचा. अनोळखी बाई काय करेल याचा नेम नाही, हाच विचार असायचा. सरुची सरुम ावशी झाली तिने सर्वाना खूप प्रेम दिले. अंग मोडून काम केले. घर सर्व दृष्टीने सांभाळले. मालकांनी पण तिच्या मुलाला शिकवले. हळूहळू व्यवसाय शिकवला. सगळं काही छान सुरू असताना कपाटातील काही दागिने नाहीसे झाल्याचे घरातील सुनेच्या लक्षात आले. सरुमावशीची चौकशी झाली, पण तिने दागिन्यांना हात लावला नाही याची सर्वाना खात्री होती. कोणीही तिच्यावर अविश्वास दाखविला नाही. दागिने कोणी नेले असतील हे तिनेच घरच्यांना सांगितले. सगळे अवाकब झाले. तरी चोर सापडायलाच हवा होता म्हणून अचानक संशयित व्यक्तीची झडती घेतली. तिने खूप आकांडतांडव केले. 

પર્ચાવરણનો અર્થ માત્ર આસપાસનો નથી. તેમાં હવા, પાણી અને આપણી નજીકની જમીન અને તેમના આંતરસંબંધોનો પણ સમાવેશ થાય છે. પર્યાવરણ અને વિકાસ એકબીજાની વિરુદ્ધ જઈ શકતા નથી. તેઓ એકબીજાના પૂરક હોવા જોઈએ.

જ્યારે વિકાસ રહેવાસીઓના લાભ માટે કરવામાં આવે છે, ત્યારે પર્યાવરણ પણ એટલું જ મહત્ત્વનું છે. જો પર્ચાવરણને ધ્યાનમાં લીધા વીના વિકાસ કરવામાં આવે તો તેની પર્યાવરણ પર નકારાત્મક અસર પડી શકે છે. જો વૈશ્વિક વૃદ્ધિના વર્તમાન પ્રવાહો યથાવત રહે, તો પછીની સદીમાં પૃથ્વી પરનો વિકાસ ઔદ્યોગિકીકરણ, પ્રદૂષણ, પોષણ સમસ્યાઓ અને સંસાધનોના અવક્ષય સુધી મર્ચાદિત છે. તેના સંભવિત પરિણામો છે, કે વસ્તી અને ઔદ્યોગિક ક્ષમતા બંને ખૂબ જ ઝડપથી અને અનિયંત્રિત રીતે ઘટશે. જો પૃથ્વી પરના તમામ સંસાધનોને સાચવવાનો વિચાર કર્યા વિના વિશ્વના વિકાસ માટે ઉપયોગ કરવામાં આવે, તો ટુંક સમયમાં પૃથ્વી એક નિર્જન સ્થળ બની જશે.

રાષ્ટ્રના વિકાસ માટે, મોટી માત્રામાં જમીન સંપાદિત કરવામાં આવે છે જેના પરિણામે વૃક્ષો કાપવામાં આવે છે. વિકાસના પરિણામે, અશ્મિભૂત ઇંધણ, પાણી અને ખનિજો જેવા બિન-નવીનીકરણીય સંસાધનો ફરી ભરાય તે પહેલાં તેનો ઝડપથી ઉપયોગ થાય છે. ગ્લોબલ વોર્મિંગ अने संसाधनोनी अवक्षय विश्वना रहेवासीओने असर કરે છે, જેના માટે તેઓ વિકાસનો લાભ મેળવી શકતા નથી. પૃથ્વીના ઘણા અમુત્ય સંસાધનો ખતમ થવાના છે, હવાની રચના ક્ષીણ થઈ રહી છે અને લોકો પહેલાથી જ જોખમમાં છે, કુદરતી રહેઠાણોને ઉલટાવી ન શકાય તેવું નુકસાન થઈ રહ્યું છે, અને આરોગ્યપ્રદ સેટિંગમાંથી કુવાઓ નીકળી રહ્યા છે. પર્ચાવરણીય વિનાશના માર્ગો આર્થિક વિકાસ અને ઔદ્યોગિકીકરણ છે.

સરકાર અને લોકોએ વાતાવરણના ઉત્સર્જનને ઘટાડવા માટે યોગ્ય પગલાં લેવા જોઈએ. તેઓએ ઔદ્યોગિકીકરણ,





ખાણકામ અને અન્ય સમાન કામગીરીની પર્યાવરણીય અસરોને ઘટાડવાના હેત્થી નીતિઓનો અમલ કરવો જોઈએ. વર્તમાન કૃષિ ટેકનોલોજીની ખામીઓ વૈજ્ઞાનિક અભ્યાસમાં સુધારો કરીને ઉકેલવી જોઈએ.

ગ્રામીણ અને શહેરી બંને વિસ્તારોમાં પર્યાવરણીય અધોગતિનું જોખમ સૌ પ્રથમ ગરીબોને છે. જો ગરીબોને આ નુકસાન અસમાન વિતરણ સાથે થશે, તો સામાજિક અને રાજકીય સ્થિરતા દ્વારા આર્થિક વિકાસનો પાયો ગંભીર રીતે નબળો પડી જશે. રાષ્ટ્રના વિકાસ માટે આર્થિક વિકાસ ખૂબ જ જરૂરી છે. એક રાષ્ટ્ર વિકસિત માનવામાં આવે છે. જો તે ત્યાંના રહેવાસીઓ માટે પૂરતી નોકરીની તકો પૂરી પાડે છે અને ગરીબી સાથે સંઘર્ષ કરવાને બદલે તેમને વધુ સારું જીવન પ્રદાન કરે. આ પ્રકારનો વિકાસ આવકની અસમાનતા ઘટાડવામાં મદદ કરે છે. રાષ્ટ્રની ઉચ્ચ આર્થિક વૃદ્ધિ પણ કરની આવકમાં વધારો અને બેરોજગારી અને ગરીબી સંબંધિત કલ્યાણ પરના સરકારી ખર્ચમાં ઘટાડો તરફ દોરી જાય છે.

વિકાસના લાભોનો સંપૂર્ણ આનંદ માણવા માટે, પર્ચાવરણનું સંરક્ષણ જરૂરી છે. વિકાસને પ્રાથમિકતા આપવામાં આ હકીકતની અવગણના કરવામાં આવી હોવા છતાં, તાજેતરના સમયમાં માનવજાતમાં જાગૃતિમાં વધારો થયો છે. આજના યુવાનો ગ્લોબલ વોર્મિંગ अने तेना परिशामो विशे **જાગૃ**ति ईलाववा माटे तेमना શ્રેષ્ઠ પ્રયાસો કરી રહ્યા છે. એવા ઘણા લોકો છે જેઓ ઈન્સ્ટાગ્રામ, ફેસબુક અને અન્ય સોશિયલ મીડિયા હેન્ડલ્સ જેવા વિવિધ માધ્યમો દ્વારા જાગૃતિ ફેલાવે છે. આજની પેઢી વન નાબુદીની ખરાબ અસરોથી સારી રીતે વાકેફ છે અને તેઓ પર્યાવરણના બગાડને રોકવા માટે શ્રેષ્ઠ પ્રયાસો કરે છે. ટકાઉ વિકાસ કરવા માટે, પર્ચાવરણને બચાવવા માટે જરૂરી સાવચેતી રાખવી જોઈએ આ બદલામાં, વર્તમાન વસ્તી તેમજ આવનારી પેઢીઓને લાભ કરશે. પર્ચાવરણને પૂરતું મહત્ત્વ આપીને આપણે સૌ લાંબા સમય સુધી વિકાસનો લાભ ઉઠાવી શકીશું
